

Sanders!

All of you have heard of, and some of you own, a sander. You might have a belt sander or random orbital sander in your garage. Folks that live in snow country can't wait for the sander to come around in the morning to sand the icy roads. There is a Colonel Sanders and currently a Sanders in Washington. So to keep up with the Jones's, whoever they are, Rolling Boxcar has its own sander.

It's known as a Traction Sander. Ingenious device which consists of a tank of sand, mounted just in front of the drive axle/tires, one on each side, on the rear of RBC. Under this tank is a rubber upside down "Y" shaped hose that points strait down to the road surface. It's rubber so it



can take the occasional rock or small obstruction and not be damaged.

When the road gets icy and traction is in question, RBC's driver can push a button in the cockpit and a vibrating motor will activate inside the sand storage tank and distribute a small amount of sand on the road just in front of the drive tires. Just a little sand is almost all it takes to get the traction RBC needs to keep on rolling. So on a cold snowy morning when RBC's mobile classroom is headed to your school, thank the sanders for giving us the traction to get there.
