


Revamping Luxury into Street Chic





Strides of Subjugation



In my exploration of the women's stiletto heel, I aimed to challenge its conventional representation as a symbol of beauty and empowerment. This project delves into the underlying themes of inequality, oppression, power dynamics, and domination prevalent in our society.

The design process was a deliberate choice to subvert the typical aesthetic associated with stiletto heels. I sculpted a clay model embodying the essence of the oppressed, depicted in dark colors to symbolize their marginalized existence. The chains around the figure's leg tether them to a ball, a haunting reminder of historical tools of torture and control.

Color played a pivotal role in conveying the layers of domination. The red heel signifies dominance, echoing the power structures that perpetuate inequality. In contrast, the black ball represents the object used for inflicting pain and control, emphasizing the agony experienced by the oppressed.

The incorporation of newspaper within the heel and tissue paper inscribed with contrasting words serves as a narrative. The red-pinned words like "power" and "domination" emphasize the language of control and supremacy. In contrast, the transparently pinned words like "pain" and "injustice" represent the silent suffering of the oppressed, often overlooked or deliberately silenced.

This piece is a commentary on the entrenched systems that perpetuate inequality and subjugation. By altering the conventional notion of a fashion item, it invites contemplation on the deeper socio-political issues embedded within our societal constructs.

"Strides of Subjugation" seeks to provoke discourse, challenging the viewer to confront the uncomfortable truths regarding power dynamics and the unseen anguish of those subdued by systemic oppression.
