## Blueprints for the Believer

#### 1. Paul's Calling and Suffering

### (Ephesians 3:1-3)

Paul identifies himself as a prisoner of Christ for the sake of the Gentiles. He was given the revelation of the "mystery," something hidden in the past but now revealed through God's grace. Just as Paul saw his hardship as part of God's plan, we can we view our challenges as opportunities for ministry.

#### 2. The Mystery of Christ Revealed

### **(Ephesians 3:4-6)**

The mystery: God's plan is to include the Gentiles as fellow heirs, forming one united body through the Gospel. God's Plan was hidden in ages past but is now revealed to His holy apostles and prophets. We are called to live as part of this unified body, free from division and hostility.

# 3. Paul's Ministry Empowered by Grace (Ephesians 3:7-9)

Paul's ministry was not from his own strength, but by the grace and power of God. He preached the unsearchable riches of Christ to the Gentiles, sharing the treasures of the Gospel. God's grace empowers you in your daily life. We can humbly serve others through that grace.

# 4. The Church's Role in Revealing God's Wisdom (Ephesians 3:10-11)

Through the church, God's manifold wisdom is revealed to both humanity and spiritual beings. God's eternal purpose was accomplished in Christ, bringing Jew and Gentile together under one covenant.

The church is not only a witness to the world but also to spiritual forces, revealing God's eternal plan. We are called to live with the awareness that our actions and faith have implications beyond the physical realm, demonstrating God's wisdom to both the seen and unseen.
