




From the Director
















Centennial, Wyoming

Centennial Tidbits

Political Boundaries before Wyoming

Quick Fact: There is more than 10,000 years of archaeological evidence of native occupation of the upper Green River Valley. By the time outsiders started arriving in the early 1800s, no tribes lived permanently in the area that is now Sublette County, but those most associated with using it in the summer were the Shoshone and Crow.

Quick Fact: As part of the broader west, the area that is now Sublette County was claimed by six different countries starting in the 1600s: United States, Great Britain, Russia, Spain, France, and Mexico. Although none of them really controlled it until the United States took full control by 1846 through a

Quick Fact: Parts of the area that is now Sublette County were under jurisdiction by eight different United States Territories from 1849 to 1890: Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Nebraska, Dakota, Louisiana, Missouri and Wyoming.

County Divisions in Wyoming

Quick Fact: Parts of the area that is now Sublette County were previously in the counties of Laramie, Carter, Sweetwater, Uinta, Lincoln and Fremont.

Quick Facts: Before Sublette County, the upper Green River Valley was divided into west and east halves by county borders with Bondurant, Daniel, Big Piney and Marbleton on the west and Cora, Pinedale and Boulder on the east.

Quick Facts: For early upper Green River Valley residents, County seats were first Evanston and Green River, later to be changed to Kemmerer and Lander. Before automobiles and good roads, it would take multiple-day trips to conduct official business.

Formation of Sublette County

Quick Fact: Efforts to create a county unifying the upper Green River Valley started in 1911, ten years before Sublette County was formed.

Quick Fact: Sublette County was originally proposed to be named Lake County or Meadow County.

Quick Fact: The Unorganized County of Sublette was officially formed on February 15th, 1921. Oscar Beck of Big Piney, William E. Enos of Daniel and Lou H. Hennick were appointed commissioners by Governor

Quick Fact: Perry W. Jenkins is known as the "father of Sublette County" for introducing legislation and getting it passed.

Quick Fact: The upper Hoback River & basin (Bondurant) were included in Sublette County instead of Teton County because Big Piney rancher's ties to summer cattle grazing in the basin.









Quick Fact: Sublette County was assigned the license plate prefix 23 in 1929 because it had the lowest assessed value of all the counties in Wyoming at the time.

Organization of Sublette County

Quick Fact: The first official place of business of the unorganized County of Sublette was the Daniel Post Office located in the Albert Brothers & Pixley Store.

Quick Fact: On June 28, 1921 the residents of Sublette County voted to organize the new county by 1139 for and 50 against.

Quick Fact: On June 28, 1921, the residents of Sublette County selected Pinedale as the county seat by a 6-vote margin, 488 for Pinedale, 482 for Big Piney and 230 for Daniel.

Quick Fact: On November 7, 1922, the residents of Sublette County elected the first officers including commissioners John Allen of Boulder, Frank Ball of Big Piney, and Vigo Miller of Daniel.

Quick Fact: On January 2, 1923, the first elected officials were sworn into office and Sublette County was officially organized.

Quick Fact: Sublette County was the last county to be officially organized in Wyoming, just one month after Teton County was officially organized.

Naming of Sublette County

Quick Fact: Sublette County was named after the five Sublette brothers of the Rocky Mountain fur trade era. All five brothers visited the Green River Valley in the early 1800s and likely all spent time in what is now Sublette County.

Quick Fact: William Sublette, one of the most famous and successful mountain men, attended 9 of the 16 rendezvous, but did not attend any of the 6 held in what is now Sublette County. Brothers Milton and Andrew did.

Quick Fact: William Sublette and William Drummond Stewart travelled the 3-month trip from St. Louis to the mountains one more time in 1843 just to vacation for two weeks on the banks of Stewart's Lake, now called Fremont Lake.

Quick Fact: There are no known descendants of the five Sublette brothers. Only Solomon had children and all died before reaching adulthood. There are thousands of descendants from Sublette cousins in the United States.

Quick Fact: Milton Sublette, known as "thunderbolt of the Rockies,", had a leg amputated due to infections from an arrow wound that hindered him for almost 10 years.

Quick Fact: Andrew Sublette was killed by a grizzly bear in Malibu Canyon, California in 1853.

Quick Fact: The Sublette Cutoff is named for Solomon Sublette.

Quick Fact: Bones buried at DeSmet Monument overlooking the Green River Rendezvous grounds may be Pinckney Sublette's remains originally buried on Fontenelle Creek in 1862.






