YOUR PET'S HEALTH

If your dog is exhibiting coughing (both moist and dry,) sneezing, nasal discharge, runny eyes, fever, lethargy, and/or difficulty breathing, your furry friend may have contracted canine influenza. The canine flu is a respiratory illness. The virus is airborne, and highly contagious. It can be spread by coughing, sneezing, and even barking. It can also be spread by contact with contaminated surfaces, such as water bowls and kennel floors. There is no cure for canine influenza, and it can lead to serious complications. There have been cases reported as near as Grand Rapids. Fortunately, canine influenza can be prevented by vaccination. If your dog comes in contact with other dogs, whether in boarding kennels, dog parks, or even visiting other dogs, please consider vaccinating him or her.

HUSKY RESCUE

On September 26, Homeward Bound staff assisted Manistee County Animal Control in rescuing 29 dogs from deplorable conditions. The huskies and husky-mix dogs were eating and sleeping on a urine- and feces-covered concrete floor in a barn. Several of the dogs may have been pregnant, and one of the dogs actually gave birth to a puppy in the back of Animal Control Officer J.R. Nelson's vehicle. The pup was not breathing at birth and J.R. saved the baby's life by doing chest compressions. The same dog later gave birth to three more puppies as she was in transit to rescue.

Shelter manager Shareen Edmondson contacted Hairy Houdini Siberian Husky Rescue, which mobilized their vast network of dedicated volunteers, and most of the dogs were removed to foster homes within two days.

Hairy Houdini enlisted the aid of volunteer groomers to cut these beautiful dogs out of what was described as "a hard shell of feces and matted hair."



Sammy is one of the rescued dogs who had particularly serious problems. Sammy had to be carried out of Homeward Bound on a stretcher. He was severely dehydrated, covered in feces, and in addition, he could not open his eyes due to a genetic condition affecting his eyelids. His eyes were surgically repaired shortly after rescue, and he is now doing well.

CAT RESCUE

In April we were notified of a situation in which 44 cats were found to be living in dangerously unhealth conditions in Manistee. They were about to be booted into the street. Manistee County Humane Society stepped in and the cats were transferred to Homeward Bound. Most of the cats had



need of medical, and even surgical, intervention. Shelter staff spent months nursing them back to health.

Eight of the females were pregnant, and gave birth to a total of 22 kittens at the shelter.

Of the original 44 rescued, thirty have been adopted. Some of the kittens born at Homeward Bound are still available for adoption.

All adoptable cats have been spayed or neutered, and are up to date on their vaccinations.

PUPPIES GALORE!

A year ago we were eagerly anticipating the arrival of the first litter of puppies to be born at Homeward Bound in several years. A mere twelve months later, and we have been home to seven additional litters! Fifty five puppies in all!



As much as we all love puppies, this put a huge strain on Homeward Bound's resources, staff, and volunteers. Shelter

staff were often present at the shelter throughout the night to check on dogs who were in labor, or to help with fragile newborns. Many staff hours were devoted to "cleaning up" after the babies. Each litter provided its own particular quirks, including one litter which chewed walls! Thanks to volunteer Nick Wreschnig for drywall repairs!
