Refer to p. ix of the manual for more information. -ck is taught here using only short a and short i. Students write the letters ck on the lines as they say the (k) sound.

For Spelling dictation pronounce the words as they are written, not as they are pronounced. This is done to avoid the confusion of the schwa. Sometimes it is helpful for the students to distinguish between a spelling pronunciation and a reading pronunciation.
