General Rules & Regulations

RULES: US Equestrian and SNHSA guidelines will be followed. The decisions of the management and judges are final.

ENTRY FEES: All regular, non-money classes are \$30 if pre-entered by Friday, June 21; or \$40 if post-entered.

- Entry fees for classes offering \$250 in prize money are \$50/class.
- Entry fees for the **Jumper Derby #200** and the **Hunter Derby #300** are \$75, and **Jumper Derby Relay #100** are \$150 per team. Horses must be entered in at least 3 other classes to be eligible to enter derbies. Hunter Derby participants must turn in a bio and declare fence heights in the show office by the end of show day Saturday. Jumper Derby and Relay riders' bios are due 2 p.m. day of competition. Order of go will be drawn two hours before start of class.
- **Entry forms must be filled out completely and received along with entry fees on or before 6 p.m., June 21 to be considered pre-entered.**

- **NO NUMBERS WILL BE ISSUED WITHOUT AN OPEN CHECK OR VALID CREDIT CARD INFORMATION.**

PAYMENTS: All checks will be made out to **Rotary Club of Reno Central**. There will be a \$50 charge on all returned checks. Credit cards will be accepted with a 3% additional fee.

SNHSA FEES: There is a \$5 per horse, non-refundable horse fee required by SNHSA. *Denotes classes not SNHSA-sanctioned, and no year-end points accrue. A \$20 SNHSA non-member fee is required for non-member riders entering SNHSA-sanctioned classes.

DOGS: SNHSA requires that dogs be on a leash at all sanctioned events. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors.



HORSE WELFARE: For the welfare of horses/ponies, a horse/pony may not enter and show in more than six (6) classes in a day.

CROSS ENTRIES: All cross-entry rules apply for classes entered. Please refer to the SNHSA Rule Book available online at www.SNHSA.org for a complete set of rules.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize money will be paid 50%, 30%, 20% in all money classes. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID UNLESS A W-9 IS FILLED OUT AND TURNED IN TO THE SHOW SECRETARY.**

Prize money will only be paid out if there are five (5) or more entries in a class.

STABLING: A limited number of stalls are available for \$175 for the entire show; includes bedding and cleaning. You are responsible for bringing your own water buckets, feeding and watering. Horses may arrive on Thursday at 10:00 am, and must leave on Sunday by 6:00 pm. Call Lynn at (775) 745-2753 to reserve.

SCHOOLING: Schooling is available **Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Thursday starting at 10 a.m.** for \$30/day/horse. Riders must have a signed and completed entry blank on file in the show office prior to schooling. *(Reminder, please clean up any manure your horse has made!)*

NON-SHOWING FEE: Horses not entered in the show must complete an entry blank and pay a fee of \$30/day and must have a signed and completed entry blank on file in the show office prior to arrival.

R.V. FEE: Limited R.V. spaces are available for \$50/night. Please call or email to reserve a space. Lynn@meadowviewfarms.biz or (775) 745-2753.



Specifications

Calcutta: Riders will be divided into teams. Each team will ride into the ring and will be auctioned off to the highest bidder. The person who buys the team that includes the winning rider will win 50% of the auction proceeds, the other 50% will go to the NNCCF. The winner will have the option to donate all or part of his winnings to NNCCF as well.

Jumper Derby Relay: Teams consist of three horse/ponies competing at 0.75m, 0.85m, and 1.00m. To be eligible, horses/ponies must enter and compete in at least 3 other classes. Team members must be declared and bios submitted in the show office by 2 pm day of competition. Horses/ponies may only compete on one team but riders may compete on a maximum of 2 teams. The course will consist of 18 jumps, equally divided by three heights. The competition will begin with the rider of the horse/pony riding at the 0.75m height, they will jump their jumps and hand the baton to the rider who is jumping the 0.85m height, this rider will jump their jumps, and then hand the baton to the rider jumping 1.00m. If the baton is dropped, rider may dismount and pick it up and continue; the penalty is the time taken. Refusals are penalized by time taken and a TEAM is allowed a total of 3 refusals before being eliminated. The first rider goes through the start line, the last rider goes through the finish line. The winner is the team with the best time and least amount of faults. The teams are encouraged to wear team costumes. Entry fee is \$150 per team.

Attire: There will also be a team costume competition and teams are encouraged to wear costumes and have a team name.

Jumper Derby: To be eligible, horses/ponies must enter and compete in at least 3 other classes. In the jumper derby, the horses/ponies and riders are judged under Table III, faults converted to time. Course will include a bank. Order of go will be drawn. A bio must be turned in to the horse show office by 2 p.m. day of competition. Entry fee is \$75.

Attire: Proper jumper attire, jackets, are requested for all classes in the Juniper Hill Arena. Standard jumper attire is permitted for classes in the Tahoe Luxury Properties Arena. Jumper formal attire or team costumes are required for the Friday evening Jumper Derby Relay, and jumper formal attire is required for the Saturday evening Jumper Derby.



Hunt and Go Hunter Derby: To be eligible, horses/ponies must enter and compete in at least 3 other classes. The hunter derby course is designed to resemble a fox hunting field and as a result, the jumps are built to resemble natural barriers found in a field.

Standard Hunt and Go Format: The Classic Hunter Round, consisting of 7-8 fences shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. After the completion of

the classic round horses will pick up their pace and pass through a set of markers to begin their handy portion of the class. The Handy Hunter Round, consisting of 5-8 fences, shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace, brilliance, and a shorter track are to be rewarded. Two scores will be given by the judging panel, with one score for the Classic Round and one score for the Handy Round. The scores will be added together to determine the total score and placement. Participants must turn in a bio and declare fence heights in the horse show office by the end of show day Saturday. Braiding and formal attire, shadbelly, is requested. Entry fee is \$75.



Almaden JR & SR Medal 2'9": Open to Junior and Amateur riders not showing over 3'3" at the same show. Three riders must enter for the class to count. The course must include a combination, two changes of direction, and two tests. First and second place qualify for the finals to be held at Brookside July 10-14, 2019.

Cloverleaf Medal 3': Open to Junior and Amateur riders not showing over 3'6" at the same show. To be judged on hands, seat, guidance and control over a jumper type course. A tone will be used to signal the rider to start the course. Any jumper type bit or equipment is allowed. Work-off will be at the judge's discretion. At least three riders must enter and show for the class to count. First and second place qualify for the finals to be held at Brookside in Oct. 3-6, 2019.

SNHSA Mini Medal: Rider and trainer must be SNHSA members. Open to Junior and Amateur riders not showing over 2'6" at the same show. Riders may not have competed in the SNHSA Jr/Am Medal Class within the preceding two years. To be shown over a course of no less than six obstacles, oxers may not exceed 18" in width, no solid jumps permitted. The course must include two tests. Two riders must enter and show for the class to count. The top 8 riders according to points up through the Medal Finals will qualify the rider for the Finals, to be held at Franktown Meadows Equestrian Facility on Sept. 8, 2019.

SNHSA Jr/Am Medal: Rider and trainer must be SNHSA members. Open to Junior and Amateur riders. Riders may not have competed in the SNHSA Mini Medal Class within the same year. The top four riders will be asked to perform additional testing. Two riders must enter and show for the class to count. The top 8 riders according to points up through the Medal Finals will qualify the rider for the Finals, to be held at Franktown Meadows Equestrian Facility on Sept. 8, 2019.
