Bill was born on April 16, 1924, and was our club's last remaining World War II veteran. Bill joined the United States Army during World War II and was stationed for several months at Fort Leavenworth as a Military Police Prison Guard. He was then sent to the Panama Canal Zone where he served in an anti-aircraft artillery unit for the duration of the War. In 1950 he joined the Kansas Air National Guard where he rose to the rank of Chief Master Seargeant. Bill retired from the Kansas Air National Guard in 1979 having served in the Guard for 29 years.

Bill was married to his long time bride, Patsy and after her death he later married Florabelle. His son, William Quint Jr, preceded him in death. Bill is survived by his daughter, Thelma, one granddaughter and one great grandson.

Bill was one of the charter members of the Wichita Militaria Collector's Club, (WMCC) which was founded in 1982. He shared his vast knowledge of antique firearms, edged weapons and military artifacts with fellow members. Bill was always happy to help WMCC members acquire new items for their collections.

In April 2024 Bill celebrated his 100th birthday and the Wichita Militaria Collector's Club hosted a little get together for him at our April meeting. We were very proud to have a World War II veteran in our organization. Bill was a real favorite with our younger members. Bill Quint's passing is a great loss to the Wichita Militaria Collector's Club and to the Wichita community. Rest In Peace Bill.
