AISA is pleased to invite current members and the wider cyber security community to submit a proposal for AISA's PerthSEC Conference, to be held at Crown Perth on Thursday 27 November 2025. The PerthSEC Conference is the single largest member event in Western Australia for professionals in the information security and cyber security industries. PerthSEC is hosted by the Western Australian AISA Branch Committee and AISA National Operations Event Team for members and broader community.

This year, the PerthSEC committee calls on the bold voices of our community to step forward and inspire – not through perfection, but through the candid exchange of hard won lessons, thoughtful insights and the courage to confront complexity head-on. The theme of PerthSEC 2025 – **Cracking Complexity**, creates a forum to share real solutions, challenge assumptions and solve problems at scale.

All submissions will be reviewed by the PerthSEC Program Committee and will have to adhere to important selection criteria – the presentation must be vendor neutral and cannot be product focused.

Our focus topic areas for PerthSEC 2025 are outlined below:

- **Strategic Leadership. Risk, Policy and Regulations**
Suggested presentation topics include executive & board engagement, public policy & government, supply chain & concentration risk and future of regulation & privacy.
- **Building Resilience: Incident Response, Emergency and Crisis Management**
Suggested presentation topics include business continuity management, security architecture and operational resilience, threat intelligence & threat hunting, cloud, application and infrastructure security.
- **The Human Element: Privacy, Crime and Emerging Threats**
Suggested presentation topics include culture & awareness, human behaviour & criminology, AI powered cyber-attacks, weaponising AI, the rise of deepfake and quantum computing.
