

REGION 5 UPDATE: CELEBRATING MOMC 2025 ACROSS THE MIDWEST

Illinois - Partnered Color Run & Resource Fair

In Illinois, MOMC was marked by a colorful and lively Color Run event in April! Military youth and their families enjoyed a day filled with activities like visiting a resource fair, painting flower pots, making bracelets, and more. The event was made possible thanks to the many volunteers and community partners who showed their support.

Indiana - Carnival Fun & Creative Arts

The second annual MOMC Celebration Carnival at Rascal's Fun Zone brought together 198 youth and family members for go-karts, mini golf, duckpin bowling, and arcade fun. The Indiana Teen Council and CYP team led resilience games and activities throughout the event. Another event, the MOMC Art Workshop at the Indy Art Center gave 25 youth the opportunity to explore block printing, foil embossing, and faux stained glass. The event concluded with a relaxing open art session featuring sketching, modeling clay, string art, and bracelet making.

Michigan - Carnival & Purple Up Boxes

Michigan's MOMC celebration included a carnival, where more than 100 service members and families enjoyed activities supported by 40 volunteers. The League of Enchantment delighted kids in superhero and princess costumes. Families also had the opportunity to explore local resources at educational tables. In addition, Michigan launched its Purple Up Boxes, an initiative inspired by the Iowa CYP Team. These kits, distributed to schools, reached over 300 students with educational tools that celebrated and supported military-connected youth.

Ohio - Honoring Our Volunteers

Ohio held a recognition ceremony at Maj. Gen. Robert S. Beightler Armory in Columbus to honor this year's OMK Military Youths of the Year and the OMK 4-H Volunteer of the Year. The three outstanding volunteers recognized at the event have collectively given more than 1,500 hours of their time to support military youth since 2022. Their dedication is a shining example of the heart behind our programs.

Minnesota - Purple Up at Mall of America®

Minnesota celebrated Purple Up Day at the iconic Mall of America®. Military youth and their families enjoyed games, a photo booth, caricatures, airbrush tattoos, treats, and character appearances. With support from sponsors, attendees also participated in a Build-A-Bear experience and enjoyed free rides at Nickelodeon Universe®.

Wisconsin - Military Kids Ball & Purple Up Camp

Wisconsin celebrations included the first-ever Military Kids Ball, held in partnership with the USO. This formal event allowed military families to enjoy aspects of military tradition together in a fun, family-friendly setting. Additionally, the state hosted a Purple Up Overnight Camp, where youth participated in wilderness skills training and resilience activities—building friendships and confidence in the great outdoors.


DELANEY C., AGE 8
