2021 Initiatives

Operation Purple Pinwheel- Our Youth Council went to local business, organizations and Military Families and asked them to put our Purple Pinwheels in support of Military Kids for the Month of April. The Pinwheels were displayed at 20 businesses along with a sign the said "We Support Military Kids #MOMC21". This was a very well received initiative that we hope to grow this year.

Space Camp Day- This year we dedicated one morning of our residential camp to complete Space Camp. Campers used S.T.E.M. activities to build stomp rockets, learn about air flow, build light boards and coding. S.T.E.M. activities help teach critical thinking and problem solving.



YOUTH COUNCIL

Mississippi has a twelve member council. Despite all the challenges, they were still able to meet virtually, and in person. The were please to be able to have face to face events and give back to their local community. The implemented new initiatives and worked hard to make sure to give back to their community as well as bring awareness to Military Kids in our state. They were instrumental in our first "Real Talk with Military Teens" to give parents the perspective of military life from a teen.

S.T.E.M EVENTS

This year we held two stand alone S.T.E.M. events as well as implemented S.T.E.M. into one of our residential camps. The fist was Fall themed and was "Chunkin Punkin and Spooktacular Science" The older kids were able to build trebuchets to throw the pumpkins and learned about Witches brew. We also hosted a virtual S.T.E.M. event that allowed students to participate in the activity with packets sent directly to their home.

Resiliency is one of our favorite skills to learn. While including these skills in many aspects of our programing, we were able train 21 youth in 5 competencies. These include Hunt the Good Stuff, Goal Setting, Energy Management, Problem Solving, Mental Games and Put It in Perspective.

ACT WORKSHOP

Mississippi National Guard Youth Programs afforded the opportunity for high school students to attend an ACT Prep Workshop. There were 35 students that participated in this workshop. With the proper COVID-19 screenings and precautions this event was able to be a success. The workshop has proved instrumental in raising test scores an average of 6 points per student. This event has proven beneficial increased scholarships for our students.

MONTH OF THE MILITARY CHILD

April is our favorite month in Child and Youth, as it serves as the month that we get to bring awareness to the sacrifice that Military Kids make throughout the year. This year we went big with 9 ways to participate and bring awareness. We are proud to announce we had our very first Governor's Proclamation to recognize MOMC. We did several community outreach events as well as an art completion. Students were encourages to paint, draw, or use any medium to express "What it means to be a Military Child". They could also use poetry. Having so many events made it possible to more participants and made sure they could participate in either virtual or in person events.
