NCNG Child & Youth Programs

Operation Kids on Guard

... Offers day events (museums, zoos, nature centers, aquariums, etc.) and day/weekend drills that provide an opportunity for our "youngest heroes" to make new friendships with other military children just like them and learn something new or what their military loved one does in the NCNG. Cost is **FREE** to families.

National Guard Teen Council

...promotes communication with NCNG Teens across the state to identify program gaps as well as providing leadership, resiliency and personal development and community service opportunities.

New Parent Packs

...are sent out to new/expectant parents and provide resources that focus on the unique experiences of parenting a baby or toddler, particularly during times of stress and separation.

FREE Camps for NCNG Kids

NCNG Kids get the real overnight camp experience at No Charge to the parents.

Camps for children 6-13 are offered every summer. This week long camp experience focuses on teambuilding, resiliency, and environmental studies with a lot of fun-filled outdoor activities as well. The campers typically get to experience canoeing, horseback riding, hiking, swimming and much more.

Teens, ages 14-18 (incoming high school seniors), also have the opportunity to attend a week long camp during the summer months. These camps typically focus more on college readiness, resiliency, positive youth development and career exploration with lots of fun in between. Teens also get the opportunity to meet other NCNG Teens and make lifelong friends.

Other Programs:

NC Pre K Program (Formerly More at Four Program)

Provides a high quality child care program for children of alerted or activated North Carolina National Guard, Reserves and Active Duty that have been ordered to duty within the last 18 months or expected to be ordered within the next 18 months. In order to be eligible, the child needs to be four years of age by August 31st of the year attending and entering kindergarten the following year.
