

# **Lincoln Children's Museum**

The C&Y Program partnered with the Lincoln Children's Museum during the fall, Christmas time and spring to bring Day Camps activities to National Guard Families Homes. National Guard Youth between the ages of 5-12 picked up day camp to go boxes from the museum.

Each box was filled with guided STEM activities to complete at home.

## Nebraska 4H

The C&Y Program worked with the Nebraska 4H to bring their summer camps to families across the state. With the Covid19 Pandemic the Nebraska 4h has made came more accessible to more families across the state. Families could order a Camp In the Box from the 4H to be sent to their house over the summer. They could pick from a STEM cooking camp in a box or a STEM craft camp in a box.

Over the summer 100 families participated in the Camp In a Box program from all over the state.

In addition to Camp In a Box we also had kids attend residential camp in Halsey National Forrest in western Nebraska with the 4H this summer.

Through partnerships with the UNL Center for Civic Engagement, Campus Red Cross, 4H, and Alpha Xi Delta Sorority, the C&Y Program recruited 14 volunteers in FY20 who completed more than 44 hours of volunteer time.

These volunteers were key to the success of YMCA youth sports and the Robotics Program. They provided many hours of volunteering and technology coaching for our youth in STEM activities.
