### HIGHLIGHTS EVENTS

- ✓ Youth Advisory and Leadership Council Symposium Focused on teen leadership, MRT skills and creating a vision for the future of the YALC program.
- ✓ **GUARDian Angel** Organized volunteers to collect and wrap gifts for families in need.
- ✓ <u>Cookies and Cocoa with Santa</u> With a focus on communication and teamwork, families worked together to build gingerbread houses and then had the opportunity to talk to Santa.

- ✓ <u>2 Family Game Nights</u> Gave families and opportunity to unplug from technology and play games while talking about effective communication.
- ✓ <u>5 Yellow Ribbon Events</u> Supported, educated and advocated for youth and families in various stages of the deployment cycle.
- ✓ <u>Virtual Month of the Military Child Celebration</u> Hosted a month long virtual celebration to honor and recognize our amazing military kids and their families. Activities included spirit week, an essay contest, various challenges, resources and military kid profiles.
- ✓ **Volunteer training** Our program added 4 active volunteers over the last year. We trained them on proper procedures, the uniqueness of being a military kid, and the mission of our program.
- ✓ <u>Camp in a Box</u> We had to be creative with our camp efforts this year so we packed 3 full days worth
  of camp activities into a box and sent them out to 50 NG kids around the state accompanied by 2 zoom
  calls.
- ✓ <u>Back to School Movie Night</u> Hosted and outdoor back to school movie event giving families an opportunity to spend quality time together and receive backpacks full of brand new school supplies.
- ✓ <u>1 Unit Family Event</u> Created family friendly crafts, answered questions on programming and activity recruited for the YALC as well as program volunteers.



#### **BEST PRACTICES**

Based on feedback from our WYNG families, we increased family events over the past year. Due to the many deployments, families requested more events that provide opportunities for quality time and activities that the whole family can do together. The focus of these events was effective communication, the importance of quality time and conversation for families, and ideas for families to spend time together without the distraction of technology. To accomplish this, we talked to our families about the importance of distraction free and engaged conversation as well as the negative effects of being disengaged with your loved ones. During events we provided families with training videos, short PowerPoint presentations, and numerous worksheets and handouts focused on healthy family engagement.

#### **NEW INITIATIVES**

#### RESILIENCY TRAINING

We trained our 11 YALC members during the Youth Council Retreat in November on Goal Setting and HTGS. We also added resiliency training into our Camp in Box curriculum with PiiP and HTGS. We planned a weekend MRT retreat for 20 teens in the Spring, however, we were forced to cancel due to COVID.
