- 1. Vermont is the largest producer of maple syrup in the United States. Maple is also the official state flavor. Cross off 6 other flavors in columns A through C.
- 2. Vermont's name comes from the French words "vert mont" meaning green mountains. Cross off any words that rhyme with green.
- 3. Vermont has no skyscrapers. Find 5 buildings in rows 1, 3 and 5.
- 4. There are over 100 covered bridges in Vermont. Cross off any words starting with the letter 'b' in rows 1, 2 and 5.
- 5. Native tribes had legends of a horned monster living in Lake Champlain. Today, that monster is named Champ and people still claim to see him! Cross off 4 scary monster parts (ex. horns) from column E and row 4.




Find your way through Vermont!



The flag of the "Green Mountain Boys," representing the Vermont National Guard, features a light blue canton adorned with 13 stars symbolizing the original thirteen colonies of the United States. This flag serves as the regimental flag for the Vermont National Guard and has its roots in the Green Mountain Boys, a group of soldiers from Vermont led by Ethan Allen, who fought for independence during the Revolutionary War. A relic of this flag from that era can be found at the Bennington Museum in Vermont. It was originally carried by John Stark, who participated in the Battle of Bennington and is believed to have flown the flag during the conflict. This flag is among the few regimental flags that have survived from the War.
