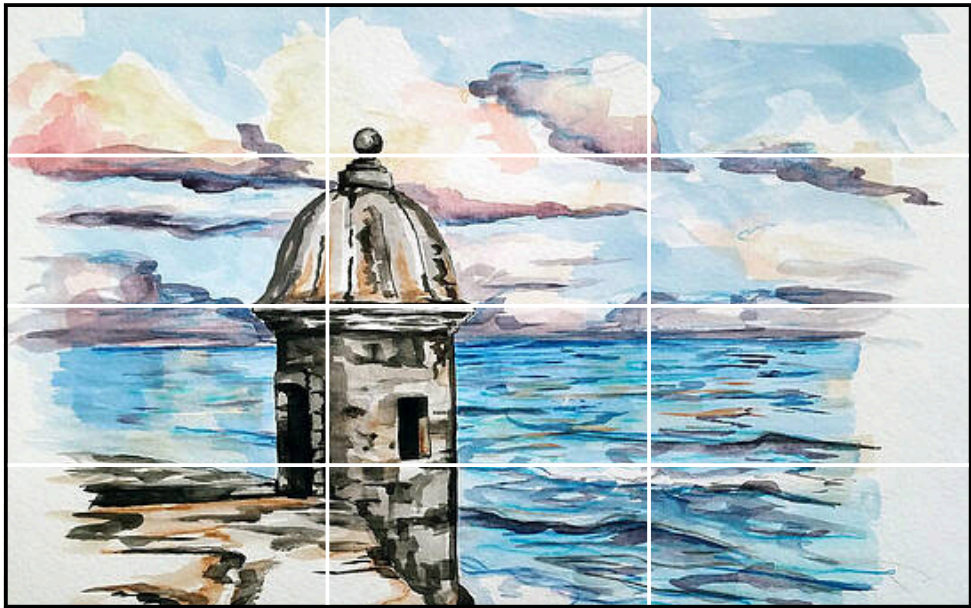
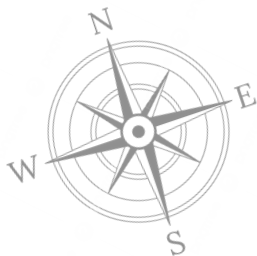

# ARTIST RECREATION

One of Puerto Rico’s most famous tourist attractions is Castle San Felipe del Morro. Known as “\_\_\_\_\_” for short, was the second fort built on the islet of what is now Old San Juan and Puerta de Tierra. Construction of El Morro began in \_\_\_\_\_ and was completed in \_\_\_\_\_. During those 250 years, it grew from a cannon-mounted promontory to a six-level fortress designed to baffle attackers approaching from the \_\_\_\_\_. In 1898, due to the Spanish American War, the Island changed hands from \_\_\_\_\_ to the \_\_\_\_\_. El Morro was designed as part of Fort \_\_\_\_\_ and was actively used as a military installation during World War I and II. In 19\_\_\_\_, the United States Army retired El Morro and turned it over to the National Park Service to establish \_\_\_\_\_. And in 1983, El Morro and the walled city of Old San Juan were declared a UNESCO \_\_\_\_\_ Site.
