The Old Man of the Mountain was a famous rock formation in New Hampshire that looked like a giant face on the side of a cliff. It was located in the White Mountains and was made of five granite ledges that lined up just right to create the profile of an old man's face. People from all over came to see it because it was a special symbol of the state. In 2003 after years of wind and rain, the rock was very weak and the ledges collapsed. Even though it is no longer there, The Old Man still appears on license plates, road signs, and the NH quarter.
