*For the May dance, we encourage (but do not require) informal period attire. For the January and March dances, wear modern casual clothes or informal period attire. We recommend wearing comfortable shoes with flexible soles. Metal heel plates are not allowed on the dance floor.

Light refreshments will be served. The cost is \$10 per person, payable at the door.
