SOMBRERO HAT ART

Sombrero (noun) Broad-brimmed, high-crowned hat made of felt or straw, worn especially in Spain, Mexico, and the southwestern United States. The sombrero, its name derived from the Spanish word “sombra”, meaning “shade,” first appeared in the 15th century.

Directions:

1. Place cup in center of plate, open side down.
2. Trace cup to make a circle
3. Cut circle out of plate (cut inside the traced line)
4. Decorate plate and cup
5. Glue cup on top of plate, open side down.

Plates and Cups will be available in Sousa lobby this week, or you may use your own.
