

- The sixth Saeculum for Israel ends in Babylonian captivity and first years of the Times of the Gentiles
- I believe Israel's 7th Saeculum Awakening began 2,520 years later when Israel takes the Temple Mount in the 6 Day War, June of 1967.
- Israel's 7th Saeculum perhaps parallels the 7th Saeculum of Western Civilization. (My analysis)


Place in Genesis Days



Why Daniel?

- Personal Impact
- •Reveals *Gentile* history in advance with 100% accuracy
- Discovery of its validation
- •Contains the most amazing prophetic passages in the Bible



The Principal Discovery

Job Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy Joshua Judges, 1 & 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings 1 & 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah Esther **Psalms** Proverbs, Ecclesiastes Isaiah Jeremiah, Lamentations Ezekiel Daniel **Minor Prophets** Matthew Luke John, 1,2, 3 John, Revelation Mark, 1, 2 Peter 14 epistles James Jude

Moses Samuel Ezra David + Solomon + Isaiah Jeremiah Ezekiel Daniel The 12 Matthew Luke John Peter Paul James Jude

Two Critical Discoveries

We have in our possession an *Integrated* Message System

66 separate books

Penned by 40 different individuals

Over thousands of years

Which provably has its origin from outside our time domain.



Old Testament Texts

- Original Hebrew ("Vorlage")
 - In the days of Ezra and Nehemiah
- Septuagint Translation (LXX)
 - 285 270 BC, 72 Scholars at Alexandria
 - Primary texts quoted in New Testament come from Greek Septuagint
- Masoretic Text (MT)
 - Derived from the Council of Jamnia

Be Bereans

- Acts 17:10 Then the brethren immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea. When they arrived, they went into the synagogue of the Jews.
- Acts 17:11 These were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so.


Daniel in the Critic's Den

- No other book is as vindicated by history.
- 332 BC: Alexander's conquest of Jerusalem: Priest Jaddua showed him references to himself in Daniel; city was spared.
- Josephus
- R. Kodewey, 1899-1917: excavations of Nebuchadnezzar's palace, et al, Banquet hall found, 173' x 56'. Rebuilt by Saddam Hussein
- Daniel had to be an eyewitness.

Ultimate Authentication

- Jesus quotes Daniel 3 times: "Daniel the Prophet"
- Quoted 3X in Ezekiel
 - Ezek 14:14, 20; 28:3
- Classed with Noah, Job, et al
- One of only two of which no evil is spoken of
- Foreign words:
 - 15 Persian words
 - 3 Greek

 - 2 Chron 35:20-24

- W bank of Euphrates Jer 46:1-6

Jehoikim released as a vassal

Temple plundered (for museum)

Hostages (Daniel et al.) taken

> Begins 70-year "Servitude of the Nation"

Siege 2

Siege #2

Jehoikim
ignores
Jeremiah's
counsel, rebels.
5 year battle;
Jehoikim dies;
Jer 22:17-19

Son Jehiachin ("Jeconiah") reigns until siege over Jer 22:24-30

[Blood curse now on royal line? Jer 22:30]

Jeconiah captured;

- 10,000 captives (including Ezekiel)
- Ez 1:1-3; 2 Kgs 24:8-20; 2 Chr 36:6-10

Zedekiah, his uncle, installed as vassal Jeremiah and Ezekiel warn against rebellion but false prophets again prevail...

Siege 3

587 BC: Zedekiah ignores Jeremiah's and Ezekiel's warnings and yields to false prophets and rebels Jer 32:5, 39:6,7; Ezek 12:13

Siege #3


3rd Siege results in the destruction of the Temple and the city:





 - •Personally receive the most astonishing prophecies in the entire Bible Dan 9-12
 - Authenticated by Jesus Himself Matt 24:15
 - Classed with Noah and Job Eze 14:14
