# **Program Report**



I believe that all of you reading this would know that our country was established by a national charter, that is the **Constitution of the United States**. But do you realize that in the negotiations of that Constitution, the founders rejected the idea of a democracy as a form of government to govern our new country? In our country the people do rule, in Greek, demos (the people) and kratos (rule) is where the word democracy is rooted. So why would the founders reject it and why would our current Vice President be repeating that certain things or people are a "threat to our democracy"?

Our founding fathers were well read in the history of world governments, including classical Greek and Roman empires which were both Republics. Our founders did not believe in pure or unrestricted Democracy. They actually feared that a pure democracy could much too easily devolve into "mob" rule, trampling the rights of the minority and covert that minorities civil liberties. So, while our government has many democratic features it also has many non-democratic features that protect liberty. Our founders favored representative government, rejecting that "the majority wins" would be the just outcome or best for the Country.

The Constitution provides that individual states are in competition with

each other. If the majority were to rule, the larger states with larger urban populations would be able to overwhelm the smaller, less populous states negating their needs and liberties. This is the best and most brilliant explanation for the Electoral College. We could get further into the Constitution, which I believe is a fascinating document to study, but then this article would be way too long. But what I really want you to be aware of is that the deletion of civics in our schools in the last 30-40 years is no accident. The Democratic party is banking on the people's ignorance of the Constitution. The idea that our rights, liberties and freedoms are ordained by our Creator rather than by a government is a novel one. We are a Constitutional Republic, and to paraphrase Ben Franklin, if we can keep it!

The Constitution also provided for limited Federal powers (amendment X of the Bill of Rights), and anything not enumerated as a federal power would fall to the individual States and further to local municipalities (the people) within those States. 
One of the biggest Shakespearean actresses of the late 1800's and early 1900's once called Tustin, California her home. Madame Modjeska (her professional stage name) was born in Poland in 1840 to a large family of actors and musicians. As a young girl, her brother took her to an acting coach and was told she had no talent and should stay home but she was determined to become an actress. She made her stage debut at age 20, was an immediate success and offered an engagement at the Warsaw Imperial Theater.

In 1868, she married Count Karol Bozenta Chlapolska, her stage manager. Poland was already under Russian domination, and they controlled and censored the theater. They decided for political and personal health issues to come to America in 1876, along with a group of their artistic friends. The group first settled in Anaheim, where they hoped to establish a Polish Colony as Anaheim also had a German Colony and they spoke German. The group had heard of the rich soil in Anaheim and since most spoke little English, and had left the stage, they were going to try their hand at farming.

This proved more difficult than they had imagined, since they lacked any knowledge of farming. They had cows but did know how to milk them or make cheese! A drought soon followed ending any hopes they had of becoming farmers. After three months, The Bozenta's moved to San Francisco, Modjeska learned English and returned to the stage. Despite her accent, Modjeska became a huge star playing Shakespearean heroines, playing at least twelve different parts. They went back and forth across the country by train, steamship and horse drawn carriages playing in New York, San Francisco, and small towns in between. She made repeated trips back to her native Poland to play in theaters there. She was admired for her subtle, natural style, artistic ideals, and influence on American theater. Even as her fame grew, she missed Orange County, her friends, and the Santa Ana Mountains she loved.

In the early 1880's, Madame Modjeska and Count Bozenta were spending their vacations in the Santa Ana Mountains as the guests of Judge J.E. Pleasants and convinced him to sell 1300 acres to her. Once she moved in, people began calling that part of Silverado Canyon Modjeska Canyon and part of Saddleback Mountain Modjeska Peak. She called home Forest of Arden from Shakespeare's play "As You Like It."

She lived at Arden until 1906 and then moved to Tustin. She considered James and Coralinn Rice among her best friends and often did performances with them. She lived in Tustin for a brief time, then purchased the home of Samuel Tustin, the son of Columbus Tustin, on Bay Island in Newport Beach.

John Robert Oglesby Private First Class United States Army 3rd Squadron, 4th Calvary, 25th Infantry Division Born July 30, 1947 Killed in Action May 15, 1968 Tan An, Vietnam

John Robert "Robbie" Oglesby was born July 30, 1947, in Orange, California to Robert L Oglesby and Shirley Rees Oglesby. He was one of six children with younger brothers, Chris, Tom, Mark, Jason and sister, Deane.

Raised in Tustin, Robbie attended Tustin elementary schools and Tustin High, graduating in 1965. While in school, he was active in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Tustin Little League, Tustin High Baseball and Basketball and was the high school sports columnist.

His mom Shirley was a Foothill High School English Teacher.

Robbie entered the United States Army in August 1967, completing his basic training in Fort Ord. Robbie arrived in Vietnam on February 12, 1968. PFC Oglesby was fighting a brush fire when he was ambushed and killed on May 15, 1968 just 3 months after arriving in Vietnam. He was 20 years old.

He is the recipient of the Purple Heart, National Defense Medal, the Vietnam Campaign Medal and the Vietnam Service Medal. He is buried at Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana.

# Positioning Kamala Harris, the California Candidate




