President's Report


Dear TARWF Members,

Recently, **TARWF President Sheryl Franke** was nominated by the Tustin Area Woman's Club, along with five other women nominated by their non-profit organizations, to vie for the coveted honor of being named Tustin Area Woman of the Year.

All six women—along with the five men similarly nominated for Tustin Area Man of the Year are outstanding leaders and volunteers in the Tustin community.

On Friday evening, May 31, Sheryl was awarded the title of 2023 Tustin Area Woman of the Year! She and Roger Carlson, nominated by Rotary Club of Tustin-Santa Ana, who was awarded the title of 2023 Tustin Area Man of the Year, will each ride in the popular Tiller Days Parade and will now, as life members, add their names to the list of those honored going back as far as 1957 (for the Man of the Year) and 1966 (for the Woman of the Year) in the Tustin area.

History of the Tustin Area Man and Woman of the Year

With our own Sheryl Franke being selected as the 2023 Tustin Woman of the Year, I thought that this month it would be fitting to share a bit about the Tustin Area Man and Woman of the Year Committee.



In 1957, Bill Moses, the editor and owner of the Tustin News decided that it would be an honor to recognize someone that contributed significantly to the community at the Tustin Chamber of Commerce's Board installation dinner. The first year, Chamber members Earl Rowenhorst and Glenn Pyeatt, City Council members Lee Byrd and Vincent Humeston and community member Jack Hall were nominated. The Tustin City Council was asked to select the winner and did so during a closed session of the City Council. The honoree was kept secret until the installation dinner, when it was announced that "outsider" Jack Hall, manager of the Utt Juice Company, had been selected. Jack was the only nominee that was not a Chamber member, nor a City Council member, but was selected due to all of his work in organizing Tustin Boys Baseball and the Tustin Boy Scouts and doing the work without taking any credit. Later, Bill Moses would be given the honor in 1958 and Earl Rowenhorst in 1966.

In 1966, the former Men of the Year, decided it was time to select a female as the Woman of the Year and Margaret Pottenger was named as Tustin's first Woman of the Year, at the Chamber Installation banquet held at the Tennis Club. Margaret had been a member of the Chamber and its past Director. The newspaper states "With Miss Pottenger's selection, it was noted, a new category is now open for future honors of women active in Tustin endeavors".

The Tustin Man and Woman of the Year remained as part of the Chamber of Commerce for many years until breaking off into its own committee. It was noted in the Tustin News in April 1997, that although the Tustin Area Man and Woman of the Year is not operated by the Chamber, the awards banquet will still be held at the Chamber Installation Dinner.

In recent years, the Tustin Area Man and Woman of the Year Committee is a separate committee, (fiscally sponsored by the Tustin Community Foundation). The previous Men and Women of the Year Life Members are responsible for selection of the winner from the candidates nominated from their non-profit organizations. Candidates are selected based on their volunteerism and leadership within their nominating organization, their volunteerism and leadership in groups beyond the nominating organization and the impact to the Tustin area. It is a difficult decision and all that are nominated are so deserving of the award. The true winner is the greater Tustin Community with the amazing work that the nominees give the community!

We have all heard that saying "the apple doesn't fall far from the tree" and there are many family combinations that have been recipients of the Man and Woman awards:

Man of the Year Joe Carruba (1967) and his stepson Man of the Year Ron Oster (1975)

Man of the Year Frank Greinke (1973) and his wife Woman of the Year Margaret Greinke (1986)

Woman of the Year Cherril Cady (1980) and her daughter Woman of the Year Kim Bass (2008)

Man of the Year Vic Gorham (1993) and his wife Woman of the Year Laurie Gorham (1994)

Woman of the Year Gretchen Whisler (2013) and partner Man of the Year Pete Beatty (2014)

Man of the Year Gary Siegel (2001) and his daughter Woman of the Year Susie McIntosh (2016)

Roger Carlson and Sheryl Franke have taken their place in history as the 2023 winners of the Tustin Area Man and Woman of the Year award!



James Clifford Lucero

Sergeant United States Army Company B, 3rd Battalion, 47th Infantry Division Born 1 March 1949 Killed in Action 13 June 1969



Mekong Delta, Vietnam

James Lucero was born in Halstead, Kansas on March 1, 1949, son of Navy Veteran Frank Lucero and Gladys Berry Lucero. He was the middle of the three sons, Frank Jr, James and Charles (Chuck).

James Lucero had attended Tustin elementary schools and Tustin High, graduating with the Class of 1968. He was an excellent athlete and while at Tustin High, lettered in both basketball and track. His real love was

baseball, especially the NY Yankees. There was often a neighborhood home run derby on Mantle Street, where the family lived. He didn't play baseball in school but was a stand-out and all-star in Little League.

His brother Chuck said that Jim was a popular guy in school, had good leadership qualities and a very protective personality. He often stood up for others, especially his friends and it seemed that everything came easy for him.

Jim had worked in construction jobs while in high school and was a supervisor in a manufacturing company when he enlisted in the Army. After completing basic training, he received the Distinguished Trainee Award for his platoon at Fort Ord.

Sgt. Lucero had served his country in Vietnam for six months and had just received his rank promotion to sergeant when he became part of a combat operation on June 11th in the Mekong Delta. Two days later he was killed during a rocket and mortar attack by enemy forces. He was just 19 years old.

He was engaged to be married upon his return from Vietnam. He is buried at Fort Rosecrans National cemetery in San Diego.


