City of Tustin History

Police Chief Jack V. Claborn City of Tustin Police Chief April 1942-1944



Jack Van Claborn was born on 20 March 1916 in San Marcos, Hays County Texas, the son of John Van Claborn and Jessie Swogger Claborn. The family moved from Texas to Redlands, California when Jack was a baby.

A young Jack (age 19) married sixteen-year-old Frances Huffman in May 1935 and the young couple made their first home on Garnsey Street in Santa Ana. Jack began his career in real estate sales with the G.O. Berry firm before becoming employed by the Edison Company.

In January 1942, Santa Ana Police Chief Earl Lentz hired Claborn to fill a vacancy temporarily on the Santa Ana Police force, working the noon to 8 p.m. shift. On 24 April 1942, Jack Claborn was hired to replace John Stanton as Chief of Police in the City of Tustin. The position paid \$150 per month. Big John Stanton was retained as Constable of Tustin.

After two short years, Jack left Tustin Police and returned to the Santa Ana Police Department, in the traffic division. Jack loved the sea and had a boat, the Zanzibar, that was docked off Newport Beach in the 1940's. In August of 1942, their son Jack Jr was born, joining sisters Virginia and Laura. Jack Junior would become a Tustin City Fire Fighter.

Jack was still employed as a police officer when he was drafted in the United States Amy on 15 June 1945 at Fort MacArthur in San Pedro. His military career was cut short after a hospital stay and he was medically discharged in August 1945. When he returned from military training, he went back into the real estate business and appliance business until his death on 29 October 1966 at age 50.

Jack Van Claborn is buried at Fairhaven Memorial Park, lawn M in Santa Ana, California. Frances Claborn passed away in 1992 and her ashes were scattered off Point Loma, California coast.

Edward Ray Burrier Private First Class United States Army Company B, 55th Armored Infantry Battalion, 11th Armored Division Born 7 July 1925 Killed in Action 31 December 1944 Belgium

Edward Ray Burrier was born on 7 July 1925 in Tustin, the oldest of two children and only son of Ray Burrier and Janet Dietrich Burrier. As a young child, the family lived with his maternal grandparents, Edward and Maud Dietrich on a ranch on Redhill Avenue. When the baby sister Alice arrived many years later, the family was still with the grandparents as Edward's father Ray was now a water pump engineer on the ranch. His father would later become a Fire Captain with the City's then all-volunteer Fire Department. Edward and Alice attended Tustin elementary schools and Tustin High, with Edward graduating in 1943. He had the distinction of being only one of 5 alumni of the school with having an almost straight A average. He was a California Scholastic Federation Life member, a member of the Masque and Gravel Club, four-year Class Parliamentarian, member of the Spanish Club and member of the Stagecraft Club having a lead in a school play.

Edward enlisted in the United States Army in August 1943, just after graduating from high school. He received his training at Fort Benning, Georgia and Camp Cooke, California. He departed for the European Theater in the fall of 1944. While serving with the 55th Armored Infantry, he was serving with General Patton's 3rd Army. He was killed during the German break-through at the Battle of the Bulge in Belgium, just 12 days after arriving on the continent.

He is buried at Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana, California.


