Some of you may not be aware but **Thorman Elementary School and Currie Middle School** (at 1402 Sycamore Ave in Tustin) have been closed and are now Sycamore Magnet Academy, teaching TK-grades 8. Before the names of Thorman and Currie fade into dust, we thought we'd let you know who the schools were named after



Jeane Thorman- Jeane Thorman Elementary

Jeane Cornelius Thorman was born in Missouri in 1905 and moved to San Diego, California. In July 1928, a well known and popular young man from Tustin, Albert Thorman, quietly married his bride, Jean Cornelius in a small ceremony in Glendale, California.

The couple returned from their honeymoon and settled on Albert's ranch on Main Street in Tustin. The couple raised two sons, Richard "Douglas" and Philip Owen Thorman. Jeane was the Executive Secretary to the Superintendent of Schools in the Tustin Unified School District for 17 years. She was the President of the Tustin Grammar School PTA, a member of First Presbyterian Church, a bridge and book club member, the Santa Ana American Legion, and member of the Republican Party. When Thorman

Elementary School was built in 1972, at the same time as Currie Middle School, she was very proud of what she called "her school". Jeane moved to Irvine after Albert died in 1978. Jean passed away on 25 March 1999 and is buried in Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana, California.



Arch Currie- A.G. Currie Middle School

Archibald Gilles Currie was born in Bemidji, Minnesota on 1 November 1902 and moved to Tustin, California in 1954 at the request of a friend and former Bemidji neighbor, Superintendent W.R. Nelson. He became a teacher and later principal at Mildred Morrow Elementary School. In 1956, he moved into the Tustin Unified District offices, as an assistant superintendent and business manager. He remained in that position

until 1972 when he was promoted to Deputy Superintendent. He was especially honored to have Currie Middle School named in his honor when the school was dedicated on 2 March 1973. Arch and his wife Lillian raised two daughters, Mary and Margaret in their house on Laurie Lane. He was actively involved as the past Master of the Masonic Lodge, the Tustin Presbyterian Church and the Republican Party. Arch Currie died in November 1979, following a surgery. He is buried in Bemidji, Minnesota.





March was Woman in History Month and we'd like you to know about Tustin's first female City Council Member! If you asked most Tustin residents who that was, most would respond with Ursula Kennedy. While Ms. Kennedy was Tustin's first elected City Council member, she was not the first female City Council member in our history. The first female City Council member was Patricia Sutcliff!

Patricia Sutcliff is a Tustin Woman of History.
Patricia moved here in 1972 with her husband Richard and their five children, Scott, Ken, Todd, Mark and Keri. The children attended Red Hill Lutheran School. At the time of her appointment to the Planning Commission, Patricia was employed by the Providence Speech and Learning Center, having received her degree in speech, with studies in history, Spanish, and drama from Chapman University.

When City Council Member Joe Langley resigned from the council in January 1975, Mayor Don Saltarelli, Agnes Bacon and Art Charleston asked Patricia to apply for the vacant position. She was one of six applicants and was selected to become Tustin's first female City Council member!

Shortly before her term was about to expire in March 1976, Patricia announced she would not be a candidate for re-election. Her five young children, their activities at school and in Little League, as well as her own commitments, were where her focus needed to be.

Later, her career would change to distribution manager of the Orange County Register and her husband, Robert Ferreira owned several Imaginarium Toy Stores. Patricia still resides in Old Town Tustin in a Colonial Revival home that was built by Ray Aunger, one-time owner of the Tustin Hardware Store.





PFC Allen Jacques DuRoy
Private First Class,
United States Army
101St Airborne Division, 2nd Battalion, 327th Infantry, D Company
Born 1 December 1948
Killed While Serving 18 April 1971
Thua Thien, Vietnam

Allen Jacques DuRoy was the second child and only son of Jacques and Ruth Jenkins DuRoy. He was born December 1, 1948 in Flint, Michigan. The family, along with his older sister Kay, moved to California in 1954 living in Garden Grove, Northern California, Santa Ana and eventually moved to Williams Street in Tustin in 1964. Allen had a lot of nicknames, starting as Skipper, then Skip, then Allen as a grown up 8 year old.

Al, as he was now called in high school, had been attending Santa Ana Valley High school when the family moved to Tustin. He decided to stay at Valley High. Al was quiet, liked school and was described as studious. A classmate from his graduating class of 1967 wrote that Al was a lot of fun and made going to school fun. Al could be seen driving around town in his 1957 turquoise and white Chevy. His sister shared that at age 16-17, Al was caught speeding his Chevy on Main Street by the Tustin Police. He was feisty and fought the ticket, explaining that all the other cars were driving the same speed and he was targeted because of his age. The judge overturned the ticket! After high school he worked for Southern California Edison and attended Santa Ana College. During his college time, Al stopped for a semester to marry his high school sweetheart, Mary Sparks on May 17, 1969. Mary and Al lived in an apartment down the street from his parents on Williams Street. His sister Kay said they were completely devoted to each other.

While on his break from college, Al was drafted into the United States Army, completing his military training at Fort Bragg. Allen found that he really enjoyed the military and talked about making it a career. His father Jacques had been a Navy veteran during WWII and grandfather Herbert, an Army veteran during WWI in France.

Allen's tour of duty in Vietnam began on October 23 rd, 1970. Six months later, while on night patrol on April 18, 1971, PFC Allen J DuRoy stepped on an American land mine and was killed while serving his country. He was the last of the Tustin Soldiers to die in the line of duty. He was just 22 years old.

Allen loved the ocean and would go there for hours to enjoy the peace. He is buried at Pacific View Memorial Park in Newport Beach, overlooking his beloved ocean.


