Program Report



We are coming down to the wire of this **mid-term election**, **November 8th** is just a few weeks away. There are a few important dates you need to be aware of and to remind your

circle of influence. You should have received your sample ballot and voters information guide. If you have not, please contact the registrar at ocvote.gov or call them at 714-567-7600 to check you registration status or mailing address.

The mail in ballots are being mailed beginning the week of October 10th. Remember, every registered voter in California will receive a mail in ballot whether requested or not. **The last day to register to vote is October 24th. Early voting begins October 25th thru November 7th at various locations throughout our area as well as at the Registrars Office which is very conveniently located to us.**

You can vote with the paper mail in ballot at home and return it to the voting center, the Registrars office or to us here at the next meeting to turn in for you if you do not want to vote in person. We still strongly recommend not to mail the ballot. You can track your ballot and confirm its receipt to the Registrar on ocvote.gov/track. If you choose to vote in person at a voting center, please be sure to destroy the mail in ballot when you do so.

The OCGOP has asked us again to vote early again so that they can more efficiently use resources to remind low propensity voters to get their ballots in or to go to the polls. You can help this effort by volunteering with the OCGOP to call voters and give them the voting information I've outlined above.

Our next meeting will be on October 28th and Dr Steven Choi will be our main guest speaker. We may have a few other candidates come by for you to meet. Please bring your sample ballots and we will go over the propositions and hopefully answer any other questions you may have regarding voting centers etc. I look forward to seeing you all then.

2 Southern California cities ranked among "Best Places to Live for Families" by Fortune

Families searching for the perfect place to settle down face a difficult task. Finding the city with the best school system, low crime rates, quality health care and community support can leave prospective homebuyers feeling flustered.

In a new report by Fortune, researchers scoured the nation to find the <u>25 Best Places to Live for Families</u>, with two Southern California cities making the list: <u>Tustin</u> (#12) and <u>San Marcos</u> (#20).

Nestled in the heart of Orange County, Tustin offers residents an excellent range of job, school and entertainment opportunities while offering world-class shopping and dining options, Fortune said. The town has a balanced offering of both historic architecture and modern development, according to the study.

With easy access to Los Angeles, the coastline and the San Gabriel Mountains, Tustin ranked 12th among the Top 25 best cities for families to live.

San Marcos, a suburb of San Diego with a population of nearly 100,000 people, was highlighted for its top-ranked school district

and "mild, year-round climate, perfect for enjoying the city's vast parks and trails program, as well as nearby lakes and beaches," Fortune wrote.

The study analyzed around 2,000 cities and towns across the U.S. and more than 215,000 data points across five categories:

- Education
- Aging resources
- General wellness
- Financial health
- Livability

Researchers specifically focused on the needs of the "Sandwich Generation," those who are saddled with "simultaneous responsibilities of raising their children while regularly caring for their own parents." Fortune estimates around 45% of Americans are a part of this generation today.

To ensure the winning places were cities where residents could afford to buy homes, Fortune eliminated locations with home sale prices that "were more than twice as high as the state median and/or more than 2.75 times higher than the national median."

Diversity was also prioritized. The study eliminated any town where "more than 90% of the population is white, non-Hispanic." No more than two cities per state and no more than one city per county/metro area were also chosen.
