Donna Peery, Office Manager of the **Tustin Historical Society** contributes articles for our newsletter regarding Tustin history and Tustin armed forces service personnel.



Missouri native William D. Bowman brought his wife and family to Tustin in 1881 from Kansas. William and his wife Ella Galloway Bowman raised their six children in Tustin, including the youngest son, William Henry Bowman, born in Tustin in March 1888. William Bowman spent the first six years in Tustin working on the raisin ranch of Hiram Snow before purchasing his own twenty acres of land at Newport and McFadden. Later, he would purchase a ranch on Redhill north of Irvine Blvd, retiring from ranching in 1916. William was a staunch Republican and members of the Advent Christian Church of Tustin. After he retired from ranching, he moved to a house built by his son, Will, near First and A Street, that still stands today. The year after celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary, Ella passed away. William passed away five years later, and both are buried at Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana.

The eldest son, Edgar Bowman, owned and operated a photography studio in Pasadena. William and Ella's second son, Charles Bowman, owned an orchard fumigation company, Bowman & Howley, eventually becoming the Graves and Howley Fumigation Company. He owned the land at Laguna and Orange Avenue and sold it to the school district for the site of Tustin High School.

William and Ella's youngest son, William Henry Bowman, was a very successful contractor in Tustin, with his partner, Sam Preble. The Bowman and Preble General Contractors built many homes in the Tustin and Santa Ana area, of which ten are still standing today. They are also credited with building the Ebel Club and the Presbyterian Church. Will and his wife Ruth

Martin Bowman were successful ranchers, builders and one of Tustin's most prominent families. Will and Ruth lived at their ranch on Newport near Vanderlip and at his parent's ranch before building their home at 1681 Mitchell in Tustin (still standing) in 1919. They were members of the Tustin Presbyterian Church, Tustin Farm Bureau, California Growers Association and Santa Ana-Tustin Citrus Association. Will died in 1964 and Ruth in 1981 and are buried at Fairhaven Memorial Park in Santa Ana.

Allen "Greg" Swaim was born December 28, 1946 to Charles Lewis Swaim and Marilyn Peterson Swaim. His family, along with brothers Mike and Don and sister Patty lived on Kirk Street in Tustin. His mother, Marilyn, worked in the Tustin High Cafeteria for more than 22 years.

Greg attended Tustin High, graduating with the Class of 1964. While at Tustin, Greg was a member of the Tustin Cross Country team and sang in the High School Choir. Classmates wrote that he had a deep abiding faith and was highly active at Tustin's Trinity Church. He was a mentor to the younger church members, serving as a Youth Camp Counselor. Others described Greg as honest, decent, and fair-minded. Many expected Greg to become a Pastor.

After graduation, Greg attended Fullerton Junior College and entered the United Sates Army in January 1966. Greg attended Officers Candidate School in Maryland before he was sent to Germany, where he was training to be a forward air observer.

In May 1968, he went to Vietnam. On August 1st, 1968, Sgt Swaim was part of an ambush team 3 miles south of Que Son. Tragically, an American artillery round fired at enemy forces fell short on Sgt Swaim's position. Sgt Swaim and Sgt Matthew Woods were both killed.

He was the recipient of the Purple Heart, National Defense Medal, the Vietnam Campaign Medal, and the Vietnam Service Medal. Sgt. Swaim was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star and the Vietnamese Military Merit Medal, which is equivalent to the American Distinguished Flying Cross Medal.

Swaim Drive in Tustin Legacy has been named in honor of Sgt. Swaim. He is buried at Fairhaven Cemetery in Santa Ana.

Orange County Republicans,

We are fresh off an exciting and encouraging CAGOP Fall Convention right here in Orange County. This was one of the most attended conventions in state party history. We were blessed to welcome Republicans from across California to Orange County - the heart of the California comeback.

We were proud to welcome President Donald J. Trump, Governor Ron DeSantis, Senator Tim Scott, Entrepreneur Vivek Ramaswamy and Nevada United States Senate candidate Sam Brown to Orange County. Every candidate delivered a clear message for their candidacies and every one of these candidates are working to retire Joe Biden and save our country.

This convention was more than just candidates. We took critical votes on the direction of our party. I first want to congratulate our Second Vice-Chair John Park on his

election as California Republican Party Regional Vice-Chair. Orange County will continue to have a seat at the table with John's election to ensure we have the resources to compete and win in 2024.

I wrote to you in previous months of my intention to fight to preserve our party's platform. My goal was to keep Republicans united heading into 2024. A coalition of leaders from across the state joined me in the fight to save our Platform of Ronald Reagan's Bold Colors. The entire Orange County legislative delegation joined me on the first day of the campaign along with our colleagues in the San Diego GOP, and our National Committeewoman and Committeeman. It was an amazing team effort. By the end of the week leading into the convention the will of the party faithful was clear. I want to thank Platform Committee Chairman O'Reilly for immediately placing a motion on the table to keep the current platform. That motion was successful, and our platform was preserved. Our voter reclamation program is in full swing, and we are performing far stronger than we anticipated at the start of this project to reregister No Party Preference Voters as Republicans ahead of the March Super Tuesday Primary. This month over 1,000 reregistered to vote after we contacted them directly. We are looking to double down on our person-to-person efforts to close the registration gap with the Democrats. I was also excited to launch our Fall Quarter of the RunRed local candidate training program. We had great attendance and are well on our way to training 100 local Republican candidates before the November General Election so Republicans are united and collaborative in our county-wide campaign.

Lastly, Republicans scored a huge victory in Anaheim on Measure A, a far-left Democrat measure that would have raised the minimum wage to \$25 an hour. Commonsense voters rejected this measure by over 66%. Americans don't support the far-left Democrat agenda and are showing it at the ballot box. We are winning the argument against Democrat control.

Like you I'm frustrated by the division within our party in Washington D.C. We cannot allow Republicans locally to be divided. If you share my frustration, I encourage you to get involved with our volunteer opportunities or supporting our local candidates with your time. There is too much on the line in November to cede ground to the Democrats because of disunity. We have a county and a country to save.

If you are patriotic, this is a great way to begin your day...Did you know there are lyrics before the words "God bless America, land that I love?") Frank Sinatra considered Kate Smith the best singer of her time and said that when he and a million other guys first heard her sing "God Bless America" on the radio, they all pretended to have dust in their eyes as they wiped away a tear or two.

Here are the facts... The link at the bottom will take you to a video showing the first public singing of "GOD BLESS AMERICA." But before you watch it, you should also know the story behind the first public showing of the song. The time was 1940. America was still in a terrible economic depression. Hitler was taking over Europe, and Americans feared we'd have to go to war. It was a time of hardship and worry for most Americans. This was the era just before TV, when radio shows were HUGE, and

American families sat around their radios in the evenings, listening to their favorite entertainers, and no entertainer of that era was bigger than Kate Smith.

Kate was also large; plus size, as we now say, and the popular phrase still used today is in deference to her, "It ain't over till the fat lady sings". Kate Smith might not have made it big in the age of TV, but with her voice coming over the radio, she was the biggest star of her time.

Kate was also patriotic. It hurt her to see Americans so depressed and afraid of what the next day would bring. She had hope for America and faith in her fellow Americans. She wanted to do something to cheer them up, so she went to the famous American songwriter, Irving Berlin (who also wrote "White Christmas") and asked him to write a song that would make Americans feel good again about their country.

When she described what she was looking for, he said he had just the song for her. He went to his files and found a song that he had written, but never published, 22 years before - way back in 1917. He gave it to her, and she worked on it with her studio orchestra. She and Irving Berlin were not sure how the song would be received by the public, but both agreed they would not take any profits from God Bless America. Any profits would go to the Boy Scouts of America. Over the years, the Boy Scouts have received millions of dollars in royalties from this song.

This video starts out with Kate Smith coming into the radio studio with the orchestra and an audience. She introduces the new song for the very first time and starts singing. After the first couple of verses, with her voice in the background still singing, scenes are shown from the 1940 movie, "You're In The Army Now." At the 4:20 mark of the video you see a young actor in the movie, sitting in an office, reading a paper; it's Ronald Reagan.

To this day, God Bless America stirs our patriotic feelings and pride in our country. Back in 1940, when Kate Smith went looking for a song to raise the spirits of her fellow Americans, I doubt whether she realized just how successful the results would be for her fellow Americans during those years of hardship and worry... And for many generations of Americans to follow. Now that you know the story of the song, I hope you'll enjoy it. Many people don't know there's a lead-in to the song since it usually starts with "God Bless America ..." So here's the entire song as originally sung... ENJOY!
