TUSTIN TILLER DAYS, OCTOBER 4, 5, 6, 2019

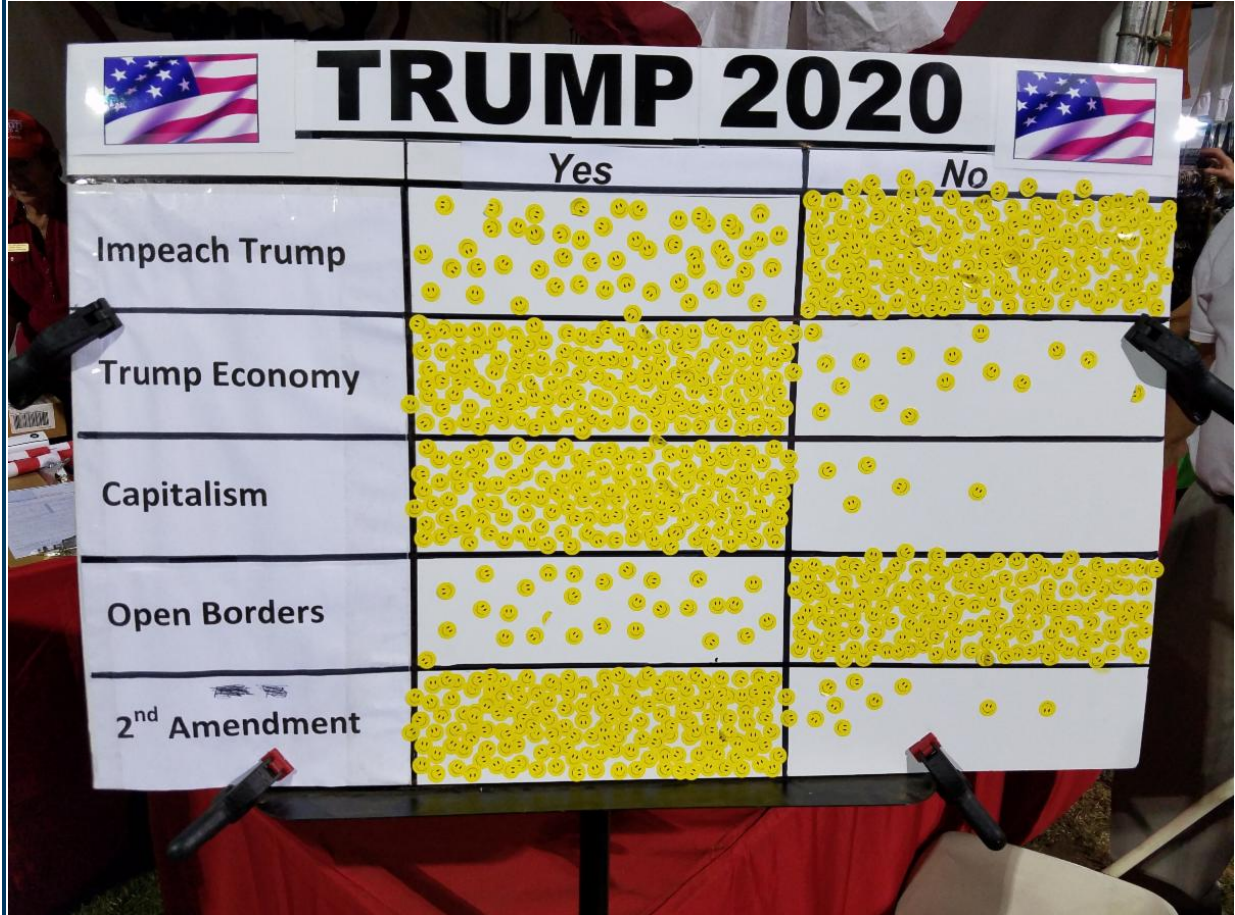
An interesting weekend was had at Tustin Tiller Days discussing the impeachment of President Trump. Most people who stopped by like our President and loved having a photo op with him.

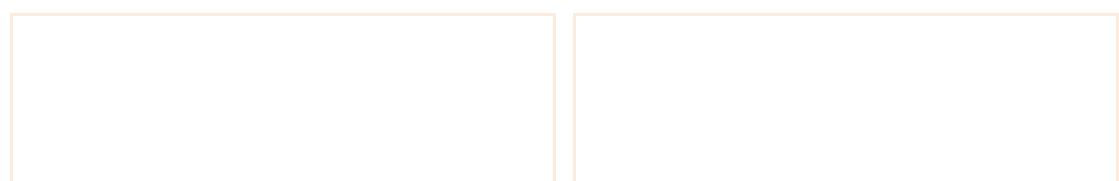

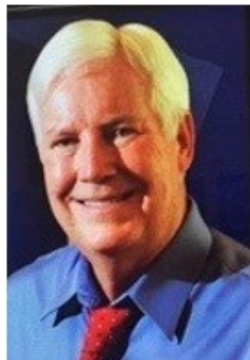

NFRW 40th BIENNIAL CONVENTION REPORT

September 26-29, Indianapolis, Indiana

Judy and Gail arrived in Indianapolis on Thursday, September 26, and were delayed getting to our hotel, by the Secret Service, and security checkpoints due to Vice President, Mike Pence speaking to the NFRW Regents and Capitol Regents. The Regent level is \$1,000 a year and Capitol Regents \$10,000 to support the NFRW.

Friday morning we took our credentials and registered. We received a tote full of goodies from the Indiana Clubs, a Program book, a copy of Amac magazine and a Citizens Guide to the Electoral College by F.L.A.G. (Foundation for Liberty and American Greatness. The Friday training seminar had four speakers that covered the Gender Gap, Leadership and Organization Building, Keys to Public Speaking and Earned Media (getting press without having to pay for it.) Friday night we had a delicious meet the candidates reception.

The Saturday General Session started at 8:45am and ended at noon. We had a preliminary Credentials Report, adopted the Convention Rules, the Program and the Report of the Minutes Committee. Rebecca Kleefisch, Executive Director, Womens Suffrage Centennial Commission gave us an interesting talk about the Republican Women who led the Woman's Right to Vote movement 100 years ago. Awards for Volunteers and Public Relations were given. The second report of the Credential Committee announced we had 577 Delegates and 70 Alternate Delegates registered.

The Nominating Committee presented their slate of candidates. President Judy Ruston asked if there were any nominations from the floor. Hearing none, she heard a motion to accept the slate as presented and it passed. Our new national officers are; Ann Schockett(NY), President, Eileen Sobjack(WA) 1st Vice President; Julie Harris(AR) 2nd Vice President; Frances Taylor(AL) 3rd Vice President; Martha Jenkins(NC) 4th Vice President; Vanessa LaFranco(NJ), Secretary, and Michelle Buckwalter Scharman(IL) Treasurer.

We heard remarks from Congressman, Adam D. Kinzinger, Illinois 16th District. Definitely an exciting voice for our future. We then heard the outgoing presidents report from Jody Rushton, the Auditors report from

Natasha Perkins, senior manager, Ross, Langan & McKindree, LLC) and a very interesting Treasurers Report from Vanessa La Franco. The morning session concluded with remarks from Nick Adams, founder and director of FLAG. In the evening we joined the other California delegation in the California Hospitality suite.

Saturday's luncheon featured a keynote addresses from Kayleigh McEnany, National Press Secretary, Donald J. Trump for President. After her speech the Ronald Reagan Leadership Award was presented. Saturday afternoon featured workshops on The Trump Victory Leadership Initiative, Diversity, Painting America's Landscape, Big Challenges I the Fight for Freedom and Liberty and Communications, Master the Media. Saturday evening was a reception and program featuring the call of Club Achievement Award winners.

Sunday offered a Prayer Breakfast and General Session with featured speaker Congresswoman Susan Brooks, Indiana 5th District as speaker. All the other awards were presented and the gavel was passed to the new president Ann Schockett, who gave closing remarks.

Legal Immigrants Sue California For Failure

To Verify Voters' Citizenship Status.

On October 1, 2019, Harmeet Dhillon and I filed a lawsuit against California because the State is failing to follow Federal law. Federal law says that a state is to ensure that only citizens are on the voting rolls. California has admitted that they are doing nothing to verify citizenship prior to placing applicants on the voter rolls.

Federal Judge Stops California from Keeping President Trump Off of California's Presidential Primary Ballot

This year, California passed an unconstitutional bill that created an additional qualification for a candidate for president of the United States. I was proud to be on the team of Lawyers represented the National Republican Party, California Republican Party, and several California voters who sued the State of California and won.

On October 1, 2019, a Federal Judge issued an injunction prohibiting California from enforcing the law that required presidential candidates to release five years of tax returns before they could be placed on the ballot. The Judge ruled that this law was unconstitutional because:

The qualifications to serve as President are in the Constitution and California cannot add to the Constitution;

The Republican Party has the right to determine who its standard bearer will be and California cannot interfere with the Republican primary process. Californians have the right to vote for the qualified presidential candidate of their choice and the state cannot tip the scales by pushing voters towards certain candidates by not placing candidates on the ballot;

Under Equal Protection, California cannot treat independent candidates one way and candidates for the major parties a different way. This law did not require independent candidates to show their tax returns and Federal law already mandated financial disclosures of presidential candidates and as such, the state was preempted from passing laws when Congress has already acted.

Suit demands state keep non-citizens from voting

President Donald J. Trump's accusation that millions of people who entered the U.S. illegally also voted in California in the last election will be considered by the same judge who just ruled the state cannot demand Trump's tax returns in order to appear on the primary ballot.

Harmeet K. Dhillon, head of Dhillon Law Group in San Francisco, sued Secretary of State Alex Padilla on Tuesday on behalf of three voters who believe their "legitimate vote is being diluted by the illegal votes of non-citizens," according to the complaint filed in the Eastern District of California. The complaint cites alleged violations of the National Voter

Registration Act. *Hoge v. Padilla*, 19CV01985 (E.D. Cal., filed Oct. 1, 2019).

The voter registration act "requires Padilla to make a determination whether someone is a citizen, and if that person is not a citizen, or is otherwise ineligible to vote, to send to him or her a notification that he or she is not registered to vote," the complaint stated.

Dhillon was also lead attorney in one of five complaints challenging SB 27, a new state law that demands presidential candidates show five years of tax returns in order to appear on the primary ballot in California. At a court hearing last month, U.S. District Judge Morrison C. England Jr. in Sacramento ruled from the bench to enjoin enforcement of the law. *Donald J. Trump for President v. Padilla*, 19CV01501 (E.D. Cal., filed Aug. 6, 2019).

England finalized his ruling in writing on Tuesday, hours after Dhillon's new case was filed.

He wrote, "Plaintiffs are likely to prevail" on claims relating to the federal Ethics In Government Act and several constitutional claims under the First and Fourteenth Amendments and the equal protection and presidential qualifications clauses.

"California will appeal this ruling, and we will continue to make our thorough, thoughtful argument for stronger financial disclosure requirements for presidential and gubernatorial candidates," Padilla said in an emailed statement from his office. "Our elected leaders have a legal and moral obligation to be

transparent with voters about potential conflicts of interest. This law is fundamental to preserving and protecting American democracy."

While no hearing date has been set, the state attorney general's attorneys will be back in front of England soon defending Padilla and the California Department of Motor Vehicles. His office may have an easier time in the new case. Trump's critics argue he has never cited concrete evidence of the illegal voting he says has taken place.

"The plaintiffs claim they are protecting voters, but this is nothing more than an underhanded attempt to bring their voter suppression playbook to California," Padilla said in a separate statement about the new complaint. "As we have seen in other states -- most recently in Kansas and Texas -- these efforts only serve to disenfranchise thousands of eligible citizens."

At the same time, however, the California New Motor Voter Act at the center of the plaintiffs' claims has unquestionably encountered problems. The law, passed in 2015 as AB 1461, was sponsored by Padilla's office. It calls on the DMV to send license information to the Secretary of State and take other steps designed to get more people registered to vote.

Opponents of the law said this would lead to non-citizens being able to vote, especially in combination with a law passed in 2014, SB 60. That allows non-citizens to get California driver's licenses.

Last year, Padilla disclosed there were problems with thousands of voter registrations though he said these problems were being fixed and most faulty registrations were being fixed in conjunction with county election officials.

The plaintiffs represented by Dhillon sent Padilla's office a notice letter in May demanding he begin comparing the state voter registration database with other records showing citizenship. Padilla responded with a letter stating he was not violating the federal voter registration law. The plaintiffs then sent a similar letter to then

acting DMV director Kathleen Webb making similar demands of her office and received the same response.
