

From the Pastor's Desk.

Looking Back to See the Future

In the financial services industry, there is a common disclaimer: "Past performance is no guarantee of future results." Financial service providers don't want current or prospective customers to assume that experiences of the past will necessarily be experienced in the future. Basically, the disclaimer tells customers, "Don't let your hopes/expectations be too high." Of course, for financial service providers this makes sense: too much is out of their control.



Advent is a time when the liturgy encourages the people of God to look back and recall past events in order to have high hopes/expectations for the future. Advent is the time when we recall the mighty acts of God in the continually unfolding salvation narrative in order to bolster our faith in God. And, of course, for the people of God this makes sense: **nothing** is beyond God's control. Advent is the time when the Church encourages the children of God to be patient.

And what do we do? We intensify the rush to Christmas. We try to make the day after Thanksgiving (or in some cases Columbus Day) to be the first day of Christmas. And we turn Christmas into the culmination of binge buying. We bring out tubs of decorations, we over-schedule ourselves, we try to cram as much "ho-ho-ho" into the first 25 days of December. The result typically is that we end the year with greater angst, tattered hope and a malnourished faith.

The Hebrew Scripture lessons in Advent take us forward from a prayer to a promise. On the First Sunday in Advent, the Isaiah text has us pray that God would come in power quickly. On the Second Sunday we read that God wants the prophet to comfort God's people by announcing that God will come. On the Third Sunday in Advent, God assures us that righteous will flourish when He comes. And on the final Sunday we hear God's promise to David that God will provide a place and someone to protect God's people. That someone will sit on David's throne forever. We know that "someone" of course is the Christ. Ironically, the Gospel lessons take us backward. They begin with a glimpse of the second coming of Christ. It is a look at the future. On the Second Sunday of Advent, the Gospel moves us back in time and we see John the Baptizer announcing the coming of the Lamb of God as the inauguration of Jesus' earthly ministry. On the Third Sunday we hear Mary's response (The Magnificat) to the angel's announcement. And on the fourth Sunday we read of the angel's announcement. The Gospel narrative moves us from promise to promise. God made good on his promise to Mary. We can trust His promise to come again and make the righteous flourish.

So, the Scriptures have us bouncing back and forth through time. For movie fans, it is very reminiscent of Doc Brown in *Back to the Future*. But the point of all of this bouncing is to remind us that God is in control. God has a plan of salvation which has been unfolding since the dawn of time. It is the Church's way of reminding us that promised future events are as dependable as the past events the people of God have experienced. So, let's keep our hopes and expectations very high. After all, with God, past performance is a *very good* indicator of future events. I encourage you to take some time in this busy Christmas rush to come and be assured of God's past performance, future promises, and constant presence. Keep a blessed Advent.

Expect the Unexpected

As many looked for and awaited the coming of the Messiah-King, it is unlikely they expected to find him lying in a manger in a barn with cows, donkeys and sheep and all the dirt and smells that come with them. They were looking for someone who would come and rule over all the earth, a king whose kingdom would be everlasting and not be destroyed. How could this baby, born in this filthy place, under these lowly circumstances, be the one? Surely, his coming would be much different than this! The expectations of many who were waiting were limited and clouded by their human understanding and ideas.

And it isn't all that different today, is it? We often encounter Jesus where we least expect him...in a hospital emergency room, in an encounter with a co-worker, at a funeral, in a rehab facility, at the grocery store...in other words, anywhere! Sometimes we just don't see him. We don't recognize him because we expect him to appear only in a certain way or a certain time or a certain place. It isn't up to us. God is full of surprises and often appears in the most unexpected places! The key can be found in our awareness and openness to meet him anywhere we are. We should maintain that Advent quality of anticipation so that we are always ready. Not only can we encounter Jesus anywhere we go, but as post-resurrection people, we take him with us everywhere we go. In his book Don't Sing Songs to a Heavy Heart, pastor, psychologist and founder of Stephen Ministries, Kenneth Haugk suggests that we carry Jesus with us when we reach out to another and often find Jesus in that other person, waiting for us. These are what I call those sacred, Holy Spirit moments of connection.

My wish for you this Advent and Christmas season is that you will experience those moments of connection and not only see and experience the joy of Christ's presence in the obvious, expected places such as in worship, music, and traditional celebrations, but also in the unexpected.
