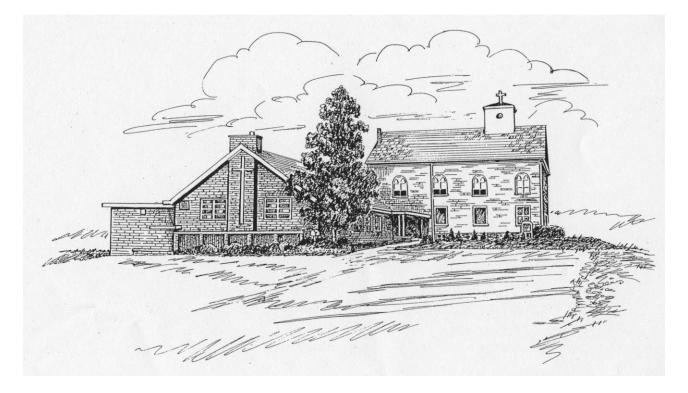

### From the Pastor's Desk

We are beneficiaries

I write this article after All Saints' Day. This means, of course, that it is also after Reformation Day. This year, the Lutheran Church celebrated its 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Because of this important milestone, I have been reflecting a great deal on how we are beneficiaries of the faith of some very dedicated people. Martin Luther was willing to risk it all including his life, to ensure that



the preaching, teaching and proclamation of the church of Jesus Christ communicated the grace of God. Imagine what our lives would be like if we were still trying earn God's favor. Imagine what it would be like if our consciences could never be sure that we were forgiven. Imagine what it would be like if our worship services, our prayers and our songs were all in Latin. Imagine what our lives would be like if we were still trying to buy enough indulgences to get ourselves and our loved ones out of purgatory. Not a pretty picture. I for one am extremely grateful that the cornerstone of my life is that I am justified by grace through faith.

And then I thought about all the saints; all the people that have died in the faith. I thought about all the people that communicated the faith, shared the faith, and sacrificed to advance the faith. I thought about the disciples who were so changed by the resurrection that they became apostles, planting the faith throughout the Roman Empire, and beyond. I thought about the early martyrs who chose to suffer torture and even to die rather than recant their faith in Jesus. I thought about the early church fathers who began developing theological frameworks which precluded dangerous heretical teaching. I thought about missionaries who transplanted the faith to new lands: Spain, Egypt and northern Africa, Ireland, North and South America. I thought about those who labored in the "new world" to establish congregations which would nourish the faith of the settlers. I thought about the Lutherans who founded, sacrificed for and sustained congregations like: the one at Fort Christina (Wilmington, DE) in 1638; St. John, *Center Square*, PA (the home church for Karen and me) 1769; and of course, St. James, Phillipsburg (1750). I thought how very blessed we all are.

But then I thought about our indebtedness to our forebears and reflected on how we might best honor them. How best to honor Martin Luther? How best to honor Peter, James, and John? How best to honor Paul, the martyrs, the ancient church fathers, Henry Melchior Muhlenberg? How best to honor our parents, grandparents and others who specifically nurtured our own faith? I think the best way is to redouble our efforts to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our community. The best way to honor the saints of the past is to provide for the saints of the future.

I am reminded of the encouraging words from the book of Hebrews:

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us"

## Social Ministry Update

The gloves, hats, and scarfs collection was very successful. They were given to Norwescap for distribution among local area children.

The "Thanksgiving Share" project is going well. A list of items needed is posted in Frey Hall lobby. Once the baskets are complete, any leftover money from the donation can will be used to purchase Shop-Rite gift cards. These cards will be presented to the two local families along with the Thanksgiving Baskets to complete their dinners. Donations will be accepted until November 19<sup>th</sup>. Two church members will then deliver them to two local families.

Social Ministry will be selling red and green links for a dollar a link. The project will be called "The Christmas Chain" and support food for the poor. It still has not been decided which organization will receive this money. The committee has two or three in mind.

Once again Social Ministry will be supporting two local families with Christmas Gifts. Suggestions of sizes and gift ideas will be posted in Frey Hall. Project will begin after Thanksgiving.

A total of fourteen lap blankets have been distributed to Brakeley and Lopatcong Care Centers. They informed us the residents love them and would like us to continue bringing them.

My name is Wayne Van Blarcom. I am 17 years old and the Senior Patrol Leader of our Boy Scout Troop here at St. James Lutheran Church. I have been a member of this congregation since 2002.

As my Eagle Scout Project, I am working with the St. James Lutheran Cemetery Committee to revitalize the old schoolhouse. As of now, we have completed the spackle work and will be beginning to sand & clean the woodwork. Our next step is to paint the walls and construct a table that will be used to display the cemetery map. I and my fellow Scouts from our troop will also be working to make the entrance safer by constructing new stairs to replace the existing steps. I have worked with the local government to obtain necessary permits and all work will be inspected.

My fellow Boy Scouts have done 2 recent projects at the cemetery. In 2015, Eagle Scout Samuel Young mapped all the veterans' graves in the cemetery so that loved ones can more easily find them and to reflect the incredible history of our community. Last year, Eagle Scout Jeremiah Williamson from our troop constructed new signage and landscaping for the cemetery entrance.
