

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As you know, St. James has been involved in both discussions with Grace Lutheran Church and a process of discerning God's will for the congregation. The culmination of both the discussions and the discernment was the congregational meeting which was held immediately following the worship service on Sunday, October 8<sup>th</sup>. This meeting was duly announced, called, and executed. There was discussion on the proposal for St. James to enter into the Shared Ministry Agreement that has been distributed to both St. James and Grace congregations. There was a vote, the results of which were 44 in favor of, and 23 opposed to, entering into the Shared Ministry Agreement.

Shortly after the meeting was adjourned, the consequences of that vote were questioned. The question was caused in part by the assumption that a 2/3 majority was required for passage. Because we needed some impartial guidance and interpretation we contacted Bishop Tracie Bartholomew, who referred the matter to Rev. Chris Boerger, Secretary of the ELCA. Rev. Boerger clarified that unless the congregation had previously decided (by way of a congregational vote) that the matter required a 2/3 vote, then only a simple majority was required. The language in the Shared Ministry Agreement document referring to a 2/3 majority ("Terms of Agreement" section, number 6) refers to what will be required for additional congregations to be permitted to join the agreement established between St. James and Grace. Further, Rev. Boerger clarified that changing the terms of a call does not constitute a call vote and therefore again, only a simple majority is required.

What does all this mean?

It means that St. James has approved its entry into the Shared Ministry Agreement with Grace Lutheran Church. Grace had a congregational meeting Sunday, October 15<sup>th</sup> at which the Shared Ministry Agreement was approved, and they voted to extend a call to Deacon Karen Kelly. Now, we the Council, will begin to take the steps to move into this exciting new reality.

This has been a stressful, and at times painful, process for some persons. There has been frustration, fear and division surrounding this process. However, speaking only in terms of that division, hurt and pain, now we can borrow from Paul's personal plan in Philippians 3: "forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, [let us] press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." That heavenly call is the mission God has given us: proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to all who need to hear it. We, the Council of St. James, are committed to working with the Council of Grace, and the members of each congregation to ensure that we capitalize on this opportunity and enhance the Christian witness to Phillipsburg and the surrounding area. We encourage each of you to be a part of this important work for the sake of the Gospel.

We thank you all for your commitment to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, your devotion to St. James and your patience and engagement with this matter.


# VBS Wrap-up

The bake sale in conjunction with the Community Day/Yard sale was a success. Approx. \$250 was made from the bake sale alone. A display table was presented, with all of Social Ministry's activities throughout the year. We were pleasantly surprised by all the positive comments made to us about the projects we engage in.



We continue to collect food for Norwescap as well as lap blankets for the Care Centers, and are still working on the sleeping mats for "Project Homeless Connect".



In early November Social Ministry will begin collecting food items to complete a Thanksgiving meal or meals.

Last year we supported two needy families.

Once again in December we will be doing two or three projects helping local less-fortunate families to have a better holiday. These will be announced at the end of November and early December.

Social Ministry will represent Saint James Lutheran Church in January 2018 at the "Project Homeless Connect" program. This program is sponsored by Warren County and held at Mercy Hall on South Main Street in Phillipsburg. We will be handing out the hygiene kits collected this summer to the homeless. This is a day when all non-profits gather together to offer their services and provide essentials for the homeless. They will be able to come in and get haircuts, coats, bags of food, blankets and sleeping mats, hygiene kits etc. This event is usually held the third week of January.
