### First Reading: Genesis 11:1-9

A reading from Genesis.

**11** The whole world had only one language, and everyone spoke it. <sup>2</sup> They moved to the east and found a broad valley in Babylon. There they made their home.

<sup>3</sup> They said to one another, "Come on! Let's make bricks and bake them well." They used bricks instead of stones. They used tar to hold the bricks together. <sup>4</sup> Then they said, "Come on! Let's build a city for ourselves. Let's build a tower that reaches to the sky. We'll make a name for ourselves. Then we won't be scattered over the whole earth." <sup>5</sup> But the LORD came down to see the city and the tower the people were building. <sup>6</sup> He said, "All these people are united and speak the same language. That is why they can do all this. Now they will be able to do anything they plan. <sup>7</sup> Come on! Let us go down and mix up their language. Then they will not be able to understand one another." <sup>8</sup> So the LORD scattered them from there over the whole earth. And they stopped building the city. <sup>9</sup> There the LORD mixed up the language of the whole world. That's why the city was called Babel. From there the LORD scattered them over the whole earth.

#### Second Reading: Acts 2:1-21

A reading from Acts.

2 When the day of Pentecost came, all the believers gathered in one place. <sup>2</sup> Suddenly a sound came from heaven. It was like a strong wind blowing. It filled the whole house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> They saw something that looked like fire in the shape of tongues. The flames separated and came to rest on each of them. <sup>4</sup> All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit. They began to speak in languages they had not known before. The Spirit gave them the ability to do this. <sup>5</sup> Godly Jews from every country in the world were staying in Jerusalem. <sup>6</sup> A crowd came together when they heard the sound. They were bewildered because each of them heard their own language being spoken. <sup>7</sup> The crowd was really amazed. They asked, "Aren't all these people who are speaking Galileans? 8 Then why do we each hear them speaking in our own native language? <sup>9</sup> We are Parthians, Medes and Elamites. We live in Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia. We are from Pontus, Asia, <sup>10</sup> Phrygia and Pamphylia. Others of us are from Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene. Still others are visitors from Rome. <sup>11</sup> Some of the visitors are Jews. Others have accepted the Jewish faith. Also, Cretans and Arabs are here. We hear all these people speaking about God's wonders in our own languages!" 12 They were amazed and bewildered. They asked one another, "What does this mean?" 13 But some people in the crowd made fun of the believers. "They've had too much wine!" they said. <sup>14</sup> Then Peter stood up with the 11 apostles. In a loud voice he spoke to the crowd. "My fellow Jews," he said, "let me explain this to you. All of you who live in Jerusalem, listen carefully to what I say. <sup>15</sup> You think these people are drunk. But they aren't. It's only nine o'clock in the morning!

<sup>16</sup> No, here is what the prophet Joel meant. <sup>17</sup> He said," 'In the last days, God says,I will pour out my Holy Spirit on all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy.

Your young men will see visions.

Your old men will have dreams.

<sup>18</sup> In those days, I will pour out my Spirit on my servants.

I will pour out my Spirit on both men and women.

When I do, they will prophesy.

<sup>19</sup> I will show wonders in the heavens above.

I will show signs on the earth below.

There will be blood and fire and clouds of smoke.

<sup>20</sup> The sun will become dark.

The moon will turn red like blood.

This will happen before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

<sup>21</sup> Everyone who calls

on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. So how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? 10 Don't you believe that I am in the Father? Don't you believe that the Father is in me? The words I say to you I do not speak on my own authority. The Father lives in me. He is the one who is doing his work. 11 Believe me when I say I am in the Father. Also believe that the Father is in me. Or at least believe what the works I have been doing say about me. 12 What I'm about to tell you is true. Anyone who believes in me will do the works I have been doing. In fact, they will do even greater things. That's because I am going to the Father. <sup>13</sup> And I will do anything you ask in my name. Then the Father will receive glory from the Son. <sup>14</sup> You may ask me for anything in my name. 




#### \* OFFERING PRAYER

#### THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

The Lord's Supper: Together with the bread and the wine we receive the body and the blood of Christ. We invite all baptized Christians to this meal. Children and adults who do not yet receive Holy Communion are invited to come forward for a blessing with their arms folded. If you need communion brought to you, let an usher know. We commune in tables of 10-15 people. The pastor will give you the bread, an assistant will give you a cup. Then two will come to pour into your cup--the first with grape juice, the second with wine. Whoever partakes receives orally the body and blood of Jesus Christ.




