

From the Council President

Friends of St. James:

The original financial goal of making the house <u>habitable</u> for under \$10,000 is nearly complete. There were some significant, unforeseen surprises that will put us over the original estimated cost, but with some future donations these cost can be covered.

Available	\$1.16
Unpaid receipts	\$122.67

The remaining cost <u>for the project</u> is minimal however much <u>labor</u> remains to be done.

- Lay the flooring in the three bedrooms and upstairs hall.
- Prep and paint the bedrooms
- All heater covers need to be sanded, installed and painted.
- Touchup existing woodwork
- Paint and install final trim
- Hang bathroom fixtures

We would appreciate additional help (labor) in the following areas:

- Painting the basement walls (Drylock)
- Backfill dirt against the outside foundation for proper drainage.
- Cleaning windows
- Removing satellite dish
- Paint basement stairwell
- Pressure wash
- Paint porch posts

There are still many things to do. Please have a look and provide your thoughts and evaluations.
