

From the Council President

Friends of St. James:

The phrase, *time flies*, proves itself over and over. Can you believe we're in the tenth month of 2019 already?

In the church, one of the things this means is that we're beginning to plan for next year. In turning to the Bible, we are reminded the Lord's guidance on stewardship. *For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it?* (Luke 14:28) We are not building a tower, although we continue to improve our St. James property and build our ministry plans for 2020. Your continued generosity will help us dream big as we continue to explore enhancements to St. James and look at where God is leading us!

Looking back at the end of Summer, we had some really great events at St. James. In August, we welcomed Pastor Gerry Kramer for his informative session "**Bible as Unique**." Adults and teens from our congregation, in addition to members from Convenent Church, joined in the interactive discussion on August 6. Our famous **BBQ chicken** event in September was sold out faster than ever; over 200 chicken dinners will grilled outside and they smelled delicious. It was great fellowship for the volunteers that helped out to put smiles on so many members and passers by stopped by that day. Our Sunday School program has kicked off again this year with Polly Newbold, Barbara Gulick and Marly Rapse helping to inspire our next generation. In addition, Dave Morris has offered to faciliate a new **adult Sunday School** on Sunday mornings as well. I thank all of them for continuing to provide learning about the Bible and ourselves outside of church service.

Church council is also keeping busy. Council met with Pastor Summer in August for a morning "offsite" to discuss what it means to be a family church and the qualities we would look for in a new pastor. The meeting closes a year of healing and preparing to move forward to find a new pastor. I encourage you to connect with council members on qualities you would look for in a new pastor. We are seeking input as we work towards the call process – defining who we are, where we are going, and who would be a great fit to join in that mission. In addition, council is looking into architecture plans to enhance the facilities of the church kitchen; ultimately bringing it up to code for cooking events like the monthly breakfast and BBQ dinner. An Old Sexton from: Easton Free Press, April 27, 1871


There resides at St. James Ev. Lutheran Church, Greenwich, Warren County, a colored man named John Innes, who has held the position of sexton in the above named church for a period of thirty-one years on the 1st of April last. His history is an interesting one, and is deserving of more than a passing notice.

At the age of four years he was bound out by his mother to a Major Hougabout, who lived near St. James' Church until he should reach the age of twenty-one years. He not only remained until the close of the time for which he was indentured, but continued with his old master for three years longer. He then spent six months in the village of Bloomsbury, where he was married. On the 1st of April following his marriage, he removed with is wife to the vicinity of the church where he was raised, and has served in the capacity of Sexton ever since.

During that time he has dug over six hundred graves, except four or five graves, which were moved by others, he has opened every grave in the burying ground of St. James' since his entrance upon his duty as sexton. It is also worthy of notice that the church was opened by himself for thirty-one years, except on four occasions on account of sickness or absence.

He has enjoyed the confidence and esteem of the congregation, and is highly respected by all. In the long period during which he has served the church, nothing even of the most trifling character has occurred to mar the pleasure between him and his employers, and should his life be spared, may many more years be added to the already long term of his service.

It is doubtful if another case like the above can be produced. Usually the term of service is not of long continuance, because of difference



between him and the church he serves, or on account of an unwillingness to remain long in such a position, but the case of J. Innes, of St. James' church, proves that sometimes a difficult duty may be performed for a long time to the satisfaction of all concerned.

Grow through Scripture


In August, our congregation member Holly Chemidlin provided a talk on his understanding and reflecting on the readings for the day.
