Keeping Us Healthy

We have entered cold and flu season. Also on the rise is Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) in children and some adults. It is difficult to know whether a child's symptoms are that of a cold, flu, RSV, or COVID. For that reason, we are continuing to follow the guidelines set forth by the health department. These guidelines are being updated presently and a new flow chart will be sent to you via email as soon as it is available.

RSV is a virus causing respiratory illness and is frequently the cause of bronchiolitis and pneumonia. Symptoms of RSV are similar to that of the cold and start with a fever, runny nose, cough, and wheezing. Someone with RSV is contagious for usually 3-8 days.

Ways to help prevent the spread of RSV is with good hand washing, covering coughs and sneezes using a tissue or cough pocket (the inner part of your elbow area), clean frequently touched surfaces, avoid close contact with others. When coughing or sneezing refrain from using your hand to cover your mouth.

If your child is diagnosed with RSV or tests positive for COVID-19 please contact the school office so we can send information to families about an exposure. Your child's information will remain private. Thank you for doing your part to keep our school healthy.

HOLIDAYS

Throughout the school year there are many holidays celebrated by our Best Beginnings families. The diversity of our little school has opened doors for all of us to learn from one another and share the unique and special celebrations that take place around the world. During the month of December, we will be sharing holidays with the students. Most of these holidays share the same message of hope, joy, and light. Do your kids say "nothing" when you ask them what they did at today? Try these tricks to get your kids to talking about school.

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
WHY?
