Attendance

Doors/Security

The doors will be opened by teachers at 8:57 each morning to greet students. It would be helpful for the staff if students could line up to enter the build-

ing.

For the first few weeks we will keep the doors open until 9:10 to give families time to adjust to the morning routine. As the weeks progress, we will begin to close specific doors as soon as we have most of students in the classroom.

We understand some families need to drop other students off at other schools before dropping their Best Beginnings student. Please let your teacher know if you need to arrive late each day. We will do our best to figure out a solution that works best for everybody.

If at any time you arrive late and your class entrance door is closed, please make your way to the south entrance where you can ring the doorbell and a staff member will greet you and lead your student to their classroom. This policy is for the security of all the children and staff.

Illness

Best Beginnings Preschool is following a strict illness policy. Parents, please monitor your child and watch for illnesses. We appreciate you keeping your child home when they are not feeling well.

We are continuing to use the COVID 19 Symptom & Exposure Flowchart by the Public Health Department when experiencing symptoms, not feeling well, exposure, or positive test for COVID 19.


Allergies & Snack

Tuition for October will be due on your child's first class day of the month.

If you have signed up for automatic withdrawal it will be taken from your account on the 5th of each month, or the closest business day.

If you are paying by check, please make sure you write your child's name on the memo line, place the check in an envelope with your child's name, and hand it to your teacher.

If you are paying by cash, please make sure to have the exact amount. Place the cash in an envelope and write your child's name on the envelope and hand to your teacher. You will receive a handwritten receipt in your child's bag/backpack at the end of the day.

Tuition is considered late if not received by the 10th of the month.

If you are unable to pay tuition on time, please contact Kerry to make the proper arrangements.
