On the International Day of the Girl Child, we celebrated the journeys we witness every day at our Safe Centres.

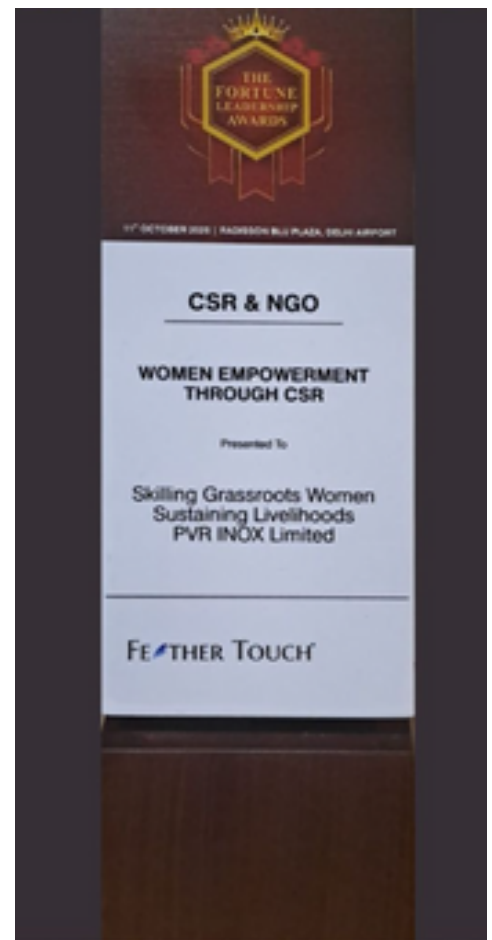

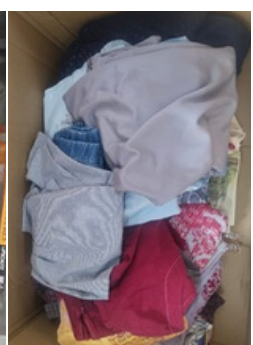
Good Touch & Bad Touch – Vikaspuri Centre

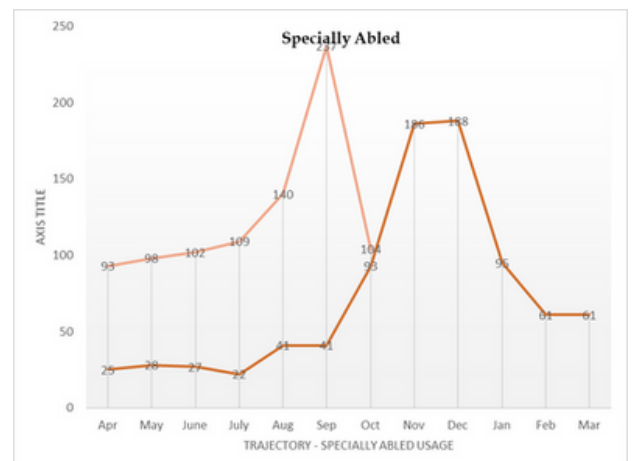
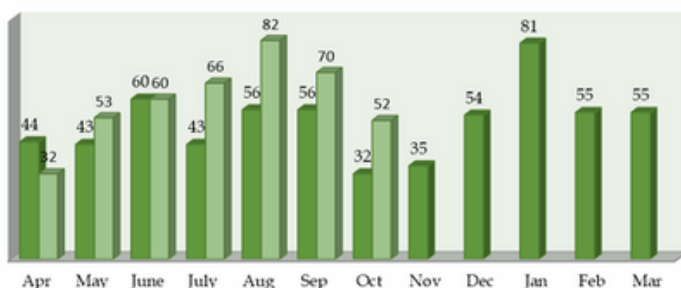

The Pink Centres and Garima Grih are safe spaces primarily used by women and young girls (over 75%). They offer traditional skilling (stitching, tailoring, Beauty & Wellness) and promote digital literacy. Footfall is increasing as Garima Grih is being established as a Common Service Centre (CSC). This equips the team to provide essential services like ABHA/ration/Aadhaar card registration, ticket booking, and job applications. The staff is also preparing for the licensing exam to run their own CSCs, creating a local source of inspiration and empowerment for young women.

IMPACT STORIES OF BEAUTY & WELLNESS AND STITCHING & TAILORING SKILLING PROGRAM



Sangeeta (R.K Puram)

Twenty-one-year-old Sangeeta from Ekta Vihar joined the PVR NEST stitching center with zero experience, motivated by her sister-in-law. Thanks to trainer patience and support, she now expertly stitches clothes for income, earning ₹3,000–₹4,000 monthly. This income allows her to support her husband and household, illustrating how skill-building empowers women to secure a brighter family future.

Neha (R K Puram)

Neha, 22, a resident of Ekta Vihar, RK Puram, has completed her Class 12 education. She recently finished her Beauty & Wellness training at the Pink Centre. Passionate about beauty work, Neha now provides basic beauty services from her home, such as facials and eyebrow shaping for her family and neighbors. Through her skills, she earns a monthly income of ₹2,000–3,000, helping her become more confident and financially independent.
