
Data Collection of users is also the responsibility entrusted to the WASH Champions. There is a process in place to capture the usage of all amenities provided in the Safe Centre. 3,401

Skilling programs tap users of sanitation facilities at Pink Centres and Garima Grih, spurring steady growth and raising community aspirations for learning new skills.





Utilization of Services - 23,573



Overall analysis



1. 37% of users are regular beneficiaries, continuously utilizing Pink Centre and Garima Grih services due to wash champions who provide guidance and information.

2. More than 80% of beneficiaries are women and young girls, with skilling programs and awareness sessions driving participation and footfall.





3. Modern training such as digital empowerment and healthcare education attracts participants, equipping women with confidence and practical tools for independence.

4. Around 40% of users come from Central Market and Gaffar Market, using the centres for resting, changing rooms, and MHM facilities.





5. 58% of overall users are children and youth, who access the centres for resting, playing, and studying.

6. Attendants support children with activities like yoga, environmental awareness, good touch-bad touch sessions, and nutritional education.

My name is Shikha Devi and I live in Sonia Camp. I studied till Class 12 and was a housewife. A neighbour told me about Garima Grih's tailoring classes, so I joined and learned sewing. Now I stitch clothes for myself and for neighbours, and use the income for my children.

With the guidance of the Garima Grih team, I was selected as an Anganwadi helper and now earn ₹7,800 a month. I feel proud to stand on my own feet, support my family, and look forward to a brighter future. Garima Grih has truly changed my life.
