These kits are not by any chance extravagant, just basic every day items consisting of such things as small appliances, pots, pans, silverware, dishes, laundry basket, shower curtain, and bedding. The first kit I delivered was to a gentleman who basically had nothing in his kitchen and was using a folding webbed lawn chair in his living room. The second gentleman to whom I delivered a kit had a bed, crock pot, a used coffee maker and a donated TV, that's it. A female veteran that I met told me that she was using a garden hose that she runs from her kitchen sink to her bathroom to take her shower. The last two veterans that I met were elated to receive a toaster! I have been very humbled each time I have delivered a kit and amazed at how appreciative the veteran is to receive basic items that we so very often take for granted. So, during this upcoming holiday season or anytime that you can, pick up an item or two that will help make the life of a veteran a bit easier. If you wish, you can also assist with the Welcome Home Kits by placing a monetary donation or even unused Kohl's Cash in an envelope marked Welcome Home Kits and give it to a bartender or the office. Every little bit helps us to do more for our veterans whom have done so much for us. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

### Home Services - Unit 10 Story



Meet Jacob and James Buss, of Bethlehem, Northampton County!

Jacob is 15 and began participating in the program at the age of eight, after being diagnosed with ADD (Attention Deficit Disorder). Jacob's younger brother, James, is 13 and has been part of the program since he was six years old. James' diagnoses are ADD, mild ASD (Autism Spectrum Disorder), and behavioral issues. Jacob and James live with their mother, Dawn. Jacob, James, and Dawn work with Elks Nurse Deb Penn. Nurse Deb has been a source of information, advocacy, and friendship over the course of their visits and communications. These relationships are vital to Pennsylvania residents such as the Buss children since they create a level of trust and stability that is rarely found when families attempt to navigate the many care paths alone. Dawn is able to rely upon Nurse Deb to assist her with education issues, an area in which many families with special needs often struggle. When extra support from an advocate like Nurse Deb is available,

more quality time can be spent with loved ones experiencing fun, enriching activities.

Two emails Nurse Deb has received from Dawn:

Deb has been our Elks home service nurse for 5 years now. She has helped me stay focused during difficult times with my ex-husband where my son's education is concerned. She's helped with their IEP, attended school meetings with me, talked to each of them on a personal level. Although she is there as a professional resource for all of us, she's become both friend and family over the years. Her support and insight is invaluable. We look forward to this relationship continuing for the foreseeable future. Merry Christmas from our family, and feel free to use this picture for the Elks!!!

I wanted to reach out to you to thank you for all your assistance and information you have provided to me and my boys. The autism information has been very helpful.
