Did you know about the Saints: On October 28, we celebrate the feast of two apostles, Saints Simon and Jude. Jude is referred to as Thaddeus in the Gospels of Matthew and Mark but as Jude in the Gospel of Luke and in the Acts of the Apostles. In the gospels, Simon is referred to as a Zealot which is a term that generally described a group of individuals that held strongly to the Torah. Both apostles are honored on the same day as tradition states that they were martyred together in Persia. "Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us, and not to the world? Jesus answered him, If a man Loves, me, he will keep my word, and my Father will Love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. He who does not Love me does not keep my words; and the word which you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me." John 14: 22-24. Let us remember these two great Saints not only on their feast day but on All Saints Day. Please join the Parish Family at mass on November 1 which is the feast of All Saints and a holy day of obligation.

Pastor's Note...Praising the God of compassion....As human beings, we never can forget the people who came into our lives during the darkest moments of our lives to support us and to console us. Their presence and their consoling words left a lasting impression in our lives, and we will always remember them with gratitude. Today, we are called to recall with gratitude all that we have experienced from the consoler in chief, the Lord himself. Consolation is a feeling of power that stems from the experience of being understood and supported, leading us to joy and peace. We are reminded through all the readings, this weekend, that the Lord comes to fill us with consolation and joy. The theme is very well summarized in our Responsorial Psalm when we proclaim, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." The Psalm goes on to further highlight the ways in which the Lord has upheld the dignity of the people by being there for them in their needs and their problems. The first reading, from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah, presents before us the promise of the Lord to radically transform the lives of people. The Lord promises them that the Lord will deliver them from everything that afflicts them, because he is able to look at them with compassion. The second reading, from the letter to the Hebrews, is a manifestation of the sacrifice of Jesus on our behalf and this is the result of his willingness to respond to God with true commitment. He sacrifices his life for the sake of the people and how he has become the high priest who is able to understand our struggles. Gospel passage is a demonstration of the understanding and the mercy Lord Jesus is able to convey to a person who has been suffering from birth. This healing of the blind man Bartimaeus is a fulfillment of the promise of the Lord which we heard in the first reading. Bartimaeus, though blind, was able to see the compassion in the heart of Jesus and called out to him. Jesus then acted with mercy toward him and transformed his life. We are called to praise the Lord of compassion, who fills us with joy.
