Scholastica and her twin brother, Benedict (feast day July 11), were born in Nursia, Italy. Saint Scholastica established a monastery of nuns at Plombariola and Benedict founded the monastery at Monte Cassino. Scholastica and Benedict remained very close and would meet to discuss spiritual matters and to support one another. When Scholastica died, her brother saw her soul in a vision ascending to Heaven. Both Scholastica and Benedict are buried at the monastery at Monte Cassino. Saint Scholastica is the patron Saint of Nuns and education. Pastor's Note: The call the response.... Jesus begins his mission by gathering a group of people who would respond to his call and dedicate their lives to spread the message of Jesus far and wide. This mission, began by Jesus from the time he began his ministry, continues even today through people who follow him as his disciples. The readings today remind us that the invitation the Lord extended to numerous people who were willing to respond to him, is also extending to everyone who has a heart to listen and respond. Discipleship is not just a human decision, but is always graced by the presence of the divine. We may not encounter the Lord the way today's readings depict, but there is always a call that is being extended to us, and there is always a response that we give to that invitation. In the first reading, from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, we see how Isaiah has an encounter with the divine. The whole situation is so overwhelming that he becomes aware of his unworthiness. But the Lord chooses him and purifies him, and then he is able to respond to God with total generosity. The Responsorial Psalm invites us to sing the praises of God in the sight of his angels. This is in response to the things the Lord has done for us. St. Paul, in the second reading, is doing exactly that. He recalls the encounter he had with the Lord and how it transformed him. He is so moved by this divine presence that he becomes a proclaimer of the goodness of God. In the Gospel we see how some ordinary individuals encounter Jesus, which radically transforms their lives and their outlook. From being a group of people whose world was indeed limited to the trade that they knew, they become people who are able to make a leap of faith into the unknown. The encounter with Jesus makes them aware of their unworthiness, and the Lord chooses them despite that, and makes them sharers of his mission. The divine encounter changes their lives and, through that, the lives of so many others. We are also invited. What is our response?
