Pastor's Note: It is a glory-filled life....

Lent comes with an unexciting presentation of itself. This dull mood is manifested in the way we decorate the Altar and its surroundings. Flowers have given way to dry twigs, and the life-radiating green color has been replaced by an unstimulating purple color. We do not sing the Gloria during Mass, and we do not hear Halleluiah, until Easter Vigil. Then there is this great emphasis on Fasting, which involves making sacrifices. True, Lent calls us to take a deeper look at ourselves and own up our mistakes and to make necessary changes and be better disciples of Jesus. This may not always be a pleasant experience. Even with all this unattractiveness about Lent, the real experience Lent provides is joy and celebration, even though delayed by a few weeks. Today, we get a glimpse of that celebration and the reason for us to trust the process that will result in transformation. All this effort on our part, the fasting, the almsgiving, the prayer and everything else, is for us to experience the glory that awaits us. The glory that was revealed during the Transfiguration of Jesus. The Apostles, who were with him during the event, were also gripped by a dull mood, due to what Jesus had told them prior to this experience. The experience of the Transfiguration filled them with great excitement. All the readings this weekend focus on the glory of God that we experience and the transformation that this experience can bring about in our lives. In the first reading God transforms the life of Abraham and his progeny, through his intervention. In the second reading, St. Paul remind us that there is going to be a transformation of our bodies to conform to the glorified body of Jesus. This glorified body is what the Apostles saw during the Transfiguration of Jesus. Since all the dullness we experience today is going to give way to glorification, we are called by the readings to trust the power of God, and continue on our Lenten disciplines with great hope and love.
