Did vou know about the Saints: On December 12, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In 1531 at the hill Tepeyac about three miles from Mexico City, our Mother Mary appeared to Saint Juan Diego (feast day December 9) four times. Our Mother requested that he go to the Bishop and inform him that a church should be built. The Bishop requested a sign and our Mother directed Juan to deliver roses which she provided as evidence of her appearance. Upon delivery of the roses, Juan's Tilma was also found to have a brilliant image of Mary. The image on the Tilma is smooth and feels like a modern-day photograph. It does not have any paint brush marks and shows no evidence of deterioration. You can also see a reflection of Juan Diego within Mary's eyes on the Tilma. The stars on Mary's Mantle within the image specifically coincide with the constellations in the sky on December 12, 1531. Our Lady of Guadalupe pray for us!

Pastor's Note: Heralding Peace....

We are into the Second Week of Advent. This Sunday we will begin lighting two candles on the Advent Wreath. This second candle represents Peace, the peace which Jesus Christ, the Savior, came to establish. For the people of Israel, establishment of peace was an important aspect of their civic and faith journey. From being a wandering people, the Lord had established them into a well settled nation. This brought about peace and comfort to the people, who had experienced constant turmoil due to the way other nations treated them. Once settled, they also began placing great importance to their worship of the Lord, and this further gave them an experience of interior peace. However, this feeling of security and experience of peace was often short lived. There were constant wars and quarrels among the nations, and it is in the context of this insecurity that we focus on the establishment of peace, both as a promise and as a lived reality for the people of Israel. The Responsorial Psalm highlights the action of the Lord, when it states with great gratitude, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." It is the work of the Lord to transform the lives of the people that other readings focus on. In the Gospel we see John the Baptist going about preaching and consoling people. This was very important for the people to hear, because they lived during a time of turmoil. In the Gospel, Luke places this preaching in the historical context, reminding the readers of the struggle and fear of the people who lived then. God was going to act in a decisive way to change their fear into hope and to establish his peace. This will happen when we listen to the Messiah, the Lord, and live as faithful people, as the second reading reminds us. There will be peace, and this peace and prosperity is what the Lord promises in the first reading from the Book of Tobit. What we are called to do is to believe in the Prince of Peace and live faithful lives. Then we, like him, will be heralding peace that will lead to joy.



The Second Advent Candle is the Peace candle or the Bethlehem candle.

9t represents the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem and also the peace Lord Jesus brought to us.
