Pastor's Note: A God of love who reaches out to all... After feeding the five thousand in the Jewish territory, and having helped the Apostles to trust in God's power, in the midst of the storms of life, Jesus now moves to the territory of the Gentiles. This is a deliberate move from the part of Jesus. He has always stressed the fact that God loves everyone and that he himself has come to minister to the Jews and Gentiles alike. Both the first reading and the second focus on the theme of universal salvation God brings about. It was a historical fact that there existed an ethnocentric outlook on the understanding of salvation by the Jewish population. Since they experienced God's love, all through their history, they concluded that God has chosen them as special people. However, this then led to their belief that they are the only ones who are worthy to experience the salvific love of God. Jesus is helping them to come out of this exclusivity when it comes to God's love, and he is opening their eyes to the fact that God, who is the author of all life, also wants children of all races and languages to be saved. From an exclusive understanding of love, he is leading them to an inclusive understanding of love. This is not an easy task, as is evident in the Gospel passage. Prejudice and hatred perpetrated over many centuries were not something that easily could be overcome. And yet it is to this task of breaking the barriers that Jesus is calling attention to, when he praises the faith of this Gentile woman. This is not a stray incident in the life and ministry of Jesus. The very fact that Gentiles felt the courage to approach Jesus, shows the charisma and openness of Jesus. He looks at people not through the eye of conventional norms, but through the eye of mercy and generosity. He is able to display these characteristics, because he is led by love. Where there is love, there can be no discrimination. It is to be transformed by this love, that Jesus is inviting us. This is not easy, since we all are products of history. However, if we let Jesus lead us, then this task becomes easy, and the path a smooth one.
