# Pastor's Note . . . A God who always comes to our rescue...

After having performed the miraculous feeding of the five thousand people, Jesus leads his disciples across the sea. This is a way of leading the disciples to a new abode of faith and trust. The disciples are frightened, because their boat is being tossed about by the storm. In contrast to that, we have the picture of a calm and confident Jesus. There is already a hint as to where Jesus gets this confidence. He is spending time in prayer. He is conversing with his Father and this contact with God enables him to go about calmly, doing what he was sent there to do. He is focused on his mission, and his life is fixed on God. And when Jesus approaches the disciples, Peter attempts to do the impossible. However, his trust and confidence suffer a setback when he sees the strong waves. His focus on Jesus is affected by the fear arising out of this unsettling experience. And then he begins to sink. This sinking feeling is not something that will last, because there, before him, is Jesus, who is able to lift him up and carry him to safety. In moments of struggle, when we experience storms of every kind in our lives, it is this focus on Jesus that will come to our help. God always comes to the aid of those who are in trouble. Sometimes we might experience a direct intervention from God. Most other times, we will feel his gentle presence, assuring us to face challenges with courage, as experienced by Elijah and stressed by St. Paul in the second reading. What matters is being focused and having the confidence that God will be there by our side.
