

HAVE A LAUGH . .. Potato Bag Strength

Pastor's Note: A God who fulfills the promises....

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, we focus on the role played by God and Mary in gifting Jesus to the world. God makes a lot of promises to the people of Israel, and the beautiful thing about his promises is that, they are all fulfilled. God makes a promise to David that his kingdom will endure forever. This will happen as a result of God bringing up a son, from the lineage of David, who will firmly establish the kingdom. Since over the years, as the people of Israel had turned away from the way of the Lord, their kingdom was periodically attacked, destroyed and trampled upon by other nations. There seemed to lack a permanently settled kingdom for the people of Israel. They always longed for the promised savior who would establish their kingdom firmly, once again. And when God makes a promise, he fulfills it, even if it might be in his time. And that is what is happening when God sends Angel Gabriel to Mary, to announce that she will conceive and bear a Son, who will be given the throne of David, his Father'. God has his way of fulfilling the promises, which might often be unconventional. The so-called King, who would establish the Kingdom firmly forever, does not seem to come from a palace. He is going to be born of an ordinary woman. Since God has his ways, human beings only have to cooperate with him. That is what Mary does. She says 'Yes' to God and then it changes everything. We are called to sing the praises of God, who fulfills the promises. That is what we remember and celebrate this Sunday.
