Pastor's Note: A family that sticks together....

Having celebrated Christmas, where we saw the suffering the family endured, we move on to reflect on and celebrate the Holy Family today. Family life is about love and understanding. That is what the readings suggest. Mother Theresa used to say that the Family that prays together, stays together. This is what we see in the readings today. There is trouble around them, there is a lot of hardship to endure, and yet they continue to trust in the Lord and in his infinite mercy and love. Love and faithfulness to God also enables people to be caring towards others. This is what the First Reading from the book of Sirach stresses.' Those who fear the Lord will honor their parents', is an indication of the faithfulness to God getting reflected in the care for others. The responsorial Psalm once again stresses the faith in the Lord and this faith and love, leading one to walk in the way of the Lord. And St. Paul stresses the attitude needed to live a happy life. It is important to be compassionate, kind, humble, gentle and patient. These are qualities that we require when we try to live together as a family. When we are filled with love, it is shown in the way we face life's situations, especially the ones involving interpersonal relations. The message of all these readings visibly manifested in the Gospel passage, where Mary and Joseph navigate the reality of childbirth and the upbringing of the child, in the midst of less-than-ideal situations. The love in their heart and their trust in the Lord enables them to be faithful in carrying out their duty as parents. They truly stick together, prompted by love and faithfulness.
