Pastor's Note: What is God's is given back to him...

Presentation of the Lord is about Jesus being made a part of the larger community. The real human aspect of Jesus is stressed here. The Lord of the universe, who took human form, is now able to associate himself with the beliefs and practices of the Jewish community. It is a way of total surrender to God and a way of giving gratitude to God. This little baby who is presented to the Lord in the Temple is not, however, an ordinary person. As the old man Simeon predicts, this baby was going to be reason for the rise and fall of many, and also a cause of division. This is not a comforting thing to hear, for the parents, about their child. Yet they joyously welcome the child as their own. In a way, they are saying yes to the will of God for this child. This scary prediction about the child does not create any doubt in the hearts of the parents of Jesus. They accept him as he is, because they know that Jesus is a gift from God and, therefore, ultimately he belongs to God. If it is God's will that this child is going to bring about division, as a result of doing what is right, then they were also going to accept and love the child. Their comforts and wellbeing is not their primary concern, but to do God's will and do it right.
