Pastor's Note . . . Letting the Word take roots in us....

Jesus now focuses on the need to be responsive to his teaching. The word of God is powerful, the first reading reminds us today. It can create and brings about the desired change to the situations where it is spoken. This power of the word is connected to the response it receives from people. When people respond to the word of God, there comes about a transformation in favor of God's ways. Jesus knows that the effectiveness of the word of God is in proportion to the response of his listeners to the word. He is also aware that the response to the word of God varies, depending on the state of mind the listener is in. Therefore, he uses the parable of the sower. On the face of it, it is a simple parable. However, the deeper meaning of the parable is what Jesus wants us to focus on. In the longer version of the Gospel reading today, Jesus himself explains the meaning of the parable to the Apostles. Our daily concerns and cares and worries can affect the way we respond to the word of God. There are times, we are preoccupied with our daily concerns, and we fail to pay attention to it. There are other times we are well disposed to the message, and we respond in a very positive way, and really transform our lives. It is this transformation of our lives which is expected of a true disciple. When we respond with full commitment to the word of God, we experience the freedom and liberation from everything that holds us back. It is a matter of being willing and ready to respond to the power of the Word of God.
