# Pastor's Note . . . Focusing on the most precious gift...

Jesus continues to talk about the Kingdom of Heaven using parables. He stresses the importance of focusing on the importance of this in our lives. The first reading gives us an inkling into the preciousness of God's values, in comparison to other costly things in the world. Solomon prays for the wisdom to judge between right and wrong, and the ability to lead with this wisdom. He valued the ways of God much more than any material wealth, and God commends and blesses him for that. The responsorial Psalm stresses the importance of the commands of God. One who loves the commands of God will always win the favor of God. And then, Jesus gives the parable of the one who finds a treasure and then goes and sells all he has and buys the land where the treasure is hidden. This shows the commitment of the person to the treasure and the primacy of place he gives to this treasure. We are called to consider the values of the Kingdom of Heaven as a precious gift and to focus on that in our lives. It is in carrying out the will of the Father that we truly become agents of the Kingdom. To be committed to the values of the Kingdom might involve making many sacrifices. What we have to focus on, as we follow Jesus, is the extent to which we are willing to go, to further the values of the Kingdom. Are we willing to make the values of Truth, Justice, Love, Fellowship and Peace, the most important thing in our lives?
