

Pastor's Note . . . Called to walk with

Jesus and be comforted...Jesus was a different kind of a leader. As the first reading suggests, he was someone who walked humbly on earth. Even when people felt that he taught with authority, unlike their teachers, Jesus never exerted his power on people. Jesus was sure of who he was and what he was sent to do. He also had the conviction that the one who sent him will be with him, and for him. And he drew his strength from the power of this loving Father. It is with this conviction that Jesus is asking those 'who are heavily burdened to come to him and take up his yoke, because his yoke is easy and the burden light'. Humility springs from an inner power and conviction. Jesus, from the very first moments of his launch of his mission, had experienced the comforting and assuring presence of his Father. And because of this inner strength, he is able to humbly serve people. Because Jesus is trying to enable his disciples to be courageous, in the face of suffering, he has to assure them that the power of God dwells with the childlike, who are humble and open to the message of God. When we have the Spirit of Jesus dwelling within us, we will be able to withstand the power of the evil one. When we are influenced by evil and selfish desires, we tend to be helpless. On the other hand, if we are willing to walk in tandem with Jesus, and be influenced by his Spirit, we will be able to overcome the weariness that comes with bearing witness to love and peace. To be a disciple of Jesus is to be transferred by his love. Relying on the power of God is the means by which Jesus was able to overcome the struggles he faced. When we, like him, are able to rely on the power of God, we will also experience comfort and consolation.
